Last week's meeting

Lee Montgomery

District Governor, Rotary District 5830

District Governor Lee Montgomery credits his membership in Rotary to an invitation in 2003 to join the Rotary Club of Cedar Creek Lake.

But he credits a young man named James for making him a Rotarian.

It happened about five years after he'd joined the club, Montgomery said last week. His club raised funds to help outfit area children at the start of a school year and he was taking one of the recipients on a shopping trip. There were the shoes, jeans and shirts of course. But though Montgomery asked more than once, James insisted he didn't need a coat. His parents had one for him, he said. When he finally asked James if he needed gloves or a hat, though, Montgomery said, the boy said yes and explained why.

"When we go to the grocery store in the wintertime, I'm the biggest of four kids, I have to ride in the back of the pickup truck," Montgomery recalled James telling him. "Mom and dad put the little kids in the front and they get in, I have to ride in the back."

At that instant, Montgomery said, "James made me a Rotarian. I knew what the fundraisers were for, I knew what all the work was about and I knew that we touched kids."

He called it his "Rotary moment," and Montgomery encouraged members to share their own moments to help prospective members understand the purpose of Rotary and how they can be a part of that. And he challenged each of us

to invite at least one person to join us this year. In his address, Montgomery also reminded members and guests of Rotary milestones being reached this year:

100th anniversary of the Rotary Foundation – Since 1947, the foundation has raised \$3.8 billion and spent \$3.4 billion on projects around the world. More than \$1.2 billion of that has gone to fight polio. "So we are doing good in the world," Montgomery said. "And as John Germ said at a meeting I went to, 'We are doing God's work in the world.'"

30th anniversary of women in Rotary – He encouraged our club to organize events to call attention to the anniversary and the achievements Rotary has made thanks to the inclusion of women. "Thank you, ladies, for all you do," Montgomery said.

Eradication of polio – "The end of polio is a very real thing," he said, despite a recent setback with three children in Nigeria infected by improperly handled vaccine. Still, the news this year is good with only 19 live cases reported so far this year. That compares to 45 at this time a year ago. "So this may be the year that the Longview Rotary Club sees the end of polio. And I want you to have some sort of a plan ... to be able to celebrate that in a big way in your community."

"We have invited him to come up to address your club and to look at what may be our next global grant project," said District Governor Lee Montgomery. "We're going to put a face with a country."

Past District Governor Carroll Greenwaldt, who continues to lead our district's project to outfit and partner with a hospital in Guatemala, will lead the program. We also will be joined by three representatives from District 6890 in Florida, which is doing projects in partnership with District 4250 as well.

Montgomery will be returning to join us for the meeting, which will be part of a visit intended to build a list of grant and international opportunities for our district and individual clubs.

"This is kind of a special thing," he said. "We've never been able to host something like this before and I think this is going to be a real international opportunity for us."
