This Day in History

Paris Donehoo provided This Day in History using his "strong

revival" voice.

On August 1, 1498, Christoper Columbus sets foot on the American mainland for the first time. Landing near Venezuela and thinking it an island, Columbus christened the land Isla Santa and claimed it for Spain.

On August, 1, 1774, dissenting British minister Joseph Priestly author of <u>Observations on Civil Liberty</u> and the <u>Nature of Justice of the War with America</u>, discovers oxygen while serving as a tutor in Wiltshire, England.

On August 1, 1914, Germany and Russia declare war against each other and "The Great War" ensued. World War I had unprecedented destruction and loss of life, resulting in the deaths of 20 million people.

On August 1, 1961, Six Flags Over Texas, the first park of the Six Flags chain, opens. During its opening year, admission for a day cost \$2.75 for an adult and \$2.25 for a child. Hamburgers were 50 cents and a cold soda set the buyer back a dime.

On August 1, 1972, future President George Walker Bush, is suspended from flying with the Texas Air National Guard for missing an annual medical examination.

On this date, in some year, Russian entrepreneur Ivan Youlose discovered a small friendly animal which fed exclusively on Clorox bottles and had a gestation period of only three days. Recognizing the potential, Youlose immigrated to the United Sates and began breeding these little creatures. Naming them "Naugha," an old Russian word meaning, "overpriced," the famous Naughahyde industry was born...as was this urban legend!



GUEST SPEAKER AND PROGRAM

Rotarian of the Day, Mike Warren introduced Amanda Bolivar. Amanda is Senior Coach with the Hunter Partnership Alliance, leading a program entitled Unshackled Leadership. Amanda spoke

on the benefits of effective listening and what stands in the way of good listening.

Listening is an integral part of effective communications, yet few ever learn how to listen effectively. The first step in learning effective listening skills is to accept that all unrelated thoughts must be suspended; in other words, stop listening to that little programmed voice always talking inside your head. More difficult than it sounds as 85% of this voice was programmed by age eighteen and 50% of this voice is programmed by age five. The next step in learning effective listening skills is to understand we listen in many different ways.

The Get to the Point listener, a listening trait of many CEOs, needs the conversation to move on quickly and doesn't take time to truly listen; their programmed voice is saying "hurry up, I don't have much time."

The Agree/Disagree listener never really listens as their programmed voice is either looking to avoid conflict and will say yes to anything, or loves conflict and is waiting for an opening to disagree.

The programmed voice of the What Am I Going to Say Next listener doesn't listen because they are too busy coming up with what they will say next.

The Let Me Tell You What You Are Going to Say listener is so preoccupied with

listeners may see themselves of knowing people very well, especially since they think they can finish others' sentences.

The I'm Always Right listener doesn't see the need to listen because they are always right.

The Attack listener listens only long enough to develop a plan of attack. An example of this type of listener is someone who won't take feedback.

The voice of the Find the Flaw listener, listens long enough to find what's wrong with the conversation and will often respond, "it will never work" or "we've done that before".

Everyone with teenagers has experienced the I Know, I Know listener. They don't listen because they have already decided they know the topic.

Finally, the Are You Approving of Me listener can't listen because they to busy worrying about what the speaker thinks of them.

Listening can be empowering if one will listen for possibilities, for commitment, for the gold, with compassion and for the win/win.
