This Day in History

On August 8, 1945, the Soviet Union officially declares war on Japan, pouring more than 1 million Soviet soldiers into Japanese occupied Manchuria and northeastern China to take on the 700,000 strong Japanese army. The Soviets surprised Japan who

of Soviet's war with Germany.

Also on August 8, 1945, President Harry S. Truman signs the United Nations Charter and the United States becomes the first nation to join the new international organization. The charter came full force when China, Soviet Union, Great Britain, France and a majority of other nations completed the ratification.

On August 8, 1974, in an evening televised address, President Richard M. Nixon announces his intention to become the first American president in history to resign. With the impeachment process underway and against him for the Watergate affair, Nixon bowed to pressure from the public and Congress to leave the White House.

Dale Lonis provided this day in history on August 15.

On August 15, 1969, Woodstock Music & Art Fair was held at Max Yasgur's 600-acre dairy farm in the Catskills, near Bethel, New York. During the sometimes rainy three-day event, thirty-two acts performed outdoors in front of 500,000 concert goers.

On August 15, 1899, Henry Ford left the Edison Company to start the Ford Motor Company and compete for the new automobile business against sixty other aspiring auto manufacturers.

On August 15, 1914, the Panama Canal opened.

On August 16, 1961, the Berlin Wall was constructed by the German Democratic Republic and completely cut off West Berlin from surrounding East Germany and from East Berlin. The wall did not open until 1990.

Other this week tidbits: Elvis Presley died on August 16, 1977, Babe Ruth died on August 16, 1948 and Genghis Khan died on August 27, 1227. In 1950, Nat King Cole's *Mona Lisa* topped the charts this week and won the Academy Award for Best Original Song in the same year.



GUEST SPEAKER AND PROGRAM

Aug 15, 201

On August 8, 2011, the speaker was **Sharon** from the Illinois State Treasurer Office. Sharon told the membership not even to try to say her last name because of its pronunciation--but did she really not give her name because she works for the Treasurer's Office?

Sharon's specialty is financial literacy. She shared that the State holds \$1.5 billion in unclaimed property and cash and holds the assets indefinitely until claimed. The State receives the unclaimed funds from businesses and financial institutions for unclaimed payroll checks, abandoned property, unclaimed savings/checking accounts, etc.

Sharon entertained questions on financial education, 529 Plans, the history of the Treasurer Office and Cash Dash.

On August 15, Rotarian of the Day, **Jim Johnston** introduced **Patty Anderson** of the Renz Center. The Renz Center serves 4,400 individuals in Kane County annually for addiction. Addiction touches almost every individual personally or through a family member or friend.

Patty spoke on the topic of gambling addition, which is called the "hidden addiction" because it is hard to detect and secretive. Many people with a gambling addiction can live in the same house with a spouse who never suspects anything until the addict has accumulated tens of thousands of dollars in debt.

Eight out of ten Americans have gambled and four to five percent of the population have a gambling addiction. Gambling addicts have the highest suicide attempt rate of all addicts and two-thirds of gambling addicts will attempt suicide at some time.

Gambling addicts are normally of above average intelligence and have a good financial head. The addiction includes all gambling activities not just casino gambling. Surprisingly, so called innocent gambling like bingo, the weekly lottery and scratch-offs can trigger addiction. Like any addiction, the gambling addict reaches euphoria, similar to a cocaine addict. The euphoria is the thrill of the bet--not even the win.

There are four stages to gambling addiction. In the Beginning Stage, addicts believe they are lucky because they have had the thrill of the "Big Win." In the next stage, or Losing Stage, the addict begins to chase their loses and place everything they win back into gambling. In the Desperation Stage, bailouts from family and friends stop and although the addict no longer wants to gamble, they cannot stop. This is the stage when some addicts resort to illegal acts like forgery, embezzlement and check floating.

There are six types of gamblers and not all are addicted. The six types are the Compulsive/Addicted Gambler, the Professional Gambler, the Social Gambler, the Anti-Social Gambler, the Serious Social Gambler and the Problem Gambler.
