- Be active in the community.
- Provide a reference verifying involvement in and commitment to the community.
- Provide an official high school transcript.
- Submit a one-page essay on part of the Rotary Four-Way Test (see last page of this packet).
- Attach a recent photograph.
- Participate in a live interview if invited by the committee.
