What is your best Rotary memory?



IN MEMORY OF TONY GREGORIO

Our friend and dedicated Rotarian **Tony Gregorio** passed away on Thursday, May 25. He was an amazing presence in our club as he was always sharing his dreams and advice on life. We will miss him greatly and will never forget the memories he has left with all of us. A funeral mass will be held on June 17, 10 a.m., at St. James Church in Glen Ellyn.

Anthony Joseph Gregorio, 96, of Batavia, beloved husband of the late Martha (Peters) died peacefully at his home on Thursday, May 25, 2017 surrounded by his family. He is survived by his children Deborah Pelland (Jack), Stephen (the late Cheryl Connelly), and Susan Macek (John); his grandchildren Drew Pelland, Ryan Pelland (Kelsey), Blake Pelland (Blaire), Daniel Gregorio (Beth), Joseph Gregorio, Sean Macek (Kaitlyn); and four great grandchildren. Anthony was born on February 10, 1921, in Chicago, the son of Angelo and Philomena (Nicoletti). He married Martha Peters on May 8, 1954 in Chicago and they celebrated 58 years of marriage until her death in 2012. He spent his career as an attorney and claims superintendent for State Farm Insurance. He maintained an active law license up until his death. He was an arbitrator for Cook County and Kane County mandatory arbitration. He was honored

with a citation for his ethical behavior as an attorney for over 50 years. He proudly served in the United States Army (World War II) as a medical technician during the Guadalcanal Campaign and the Liberation of the Philippines. He was grateful to participate in an Honor Flight to Washington, DC in recognition of his service. Anthony was an active member of the Cursillo Movement in the Joliet Diocese for more than 25 years. He was also a member of the Glen Ellyn Rotary. Anthony was an avid handball player which he played his entire adult life, and won the Senior National Handball Championship when he was 75. Anthony chose to enrich medical research and education with his bequest to the Anatomical Gift Association of Illinois. Anthony's life will be celebrated at 10:00 am Saturday, June 17, 2017 at St. James the Apostle Catholic Church in Glen Ellyn. (Chicago Tribune Obituary)
