


West Point Student to Study in England Thanks to a Connection with the Rotary Club of Glen Ellyn

United States Military Academy at West Point student Second Lieutenant **Mike Westrom** will study in England next year under the Rotary International Scholarship thanks to a connection made with Glen Ellyn Rotarian Jeff Waters.

Lieutenant Westrom heard about the scholarship from one of his instructors at West Point and the instructor connected him with Jeff. Jeff mentored Westrom through the application process for the scholarship. "Prior to applying, I didn't know much about Rotary. After reading about its mission and some of the projects in which it participates, I have come to really admire its mission and its can-do attitude that allows it to achieve great results," said Westrom.

"I am studying in England because I fell in love with the particular program that I am joining," said Westrom. He is in the process of earning a master's degree in Energy and Society in the Department of Anthropology at Durham University. "This program allows me to explore energy resource related conflict through a human-centric perspective, something that I can bring back to the Army as an officer. Modern conflict is not solely a function of technical and material mastery, but also requires leaders to understand and work peacefully with human beings," shared Westrom.

We look forward to meeting Lieutenant Westrom at a future club meeting.
