Our speaker last week was our own member Greg Ehler, who is a captain in the Salvation Army and runs the Adult Rehabilitation Center.

Greg told us how at the center of the building is the chapel because the Lord is the center of everything. The goal of the center is to help the drunk, the unemployed and the addict to get planted in the church. When someone arrives at the center, they get their haircut, their bead cut and they get a new set of clothes. They get



three meals a day for six months. The center takes care of all their needs. This is a work-training program and a client can stay there for up to one year at no cost to them.

The funding for the shelter comes from revenue generated by the four resale shops run by the Salvation Army. The stores are in Gurnee, Kenosha, McHenry and Racine. Greg said COVID last year forced them to reduce staff and hours because there was no income. Nevertheless, they were open from 10 to 6 and profits went through the roof.

Greg told us some of the great finds to come through the store, including a rare electric guitar, a Princess juke box, one of only four left in the world, and a hot tub

Greg ended by inviting us all to the annual alumni banquet at 4 p.m. on Oct. 10, where we can hear some of the great stories of recovery.
