Frank J. Schwermin Scholarship Application

In honor of the late Frank J. Schwermin, the Rotary Club of Highland Park/Highwood offers an annual scholarship to Highland Park High School seniors seeking to pursue a college degree or a certification in the health care field. Scholarships range in the amount of \$3,000 and \$6,000 per recipient.

About the Rotary Club. The Rotary Club of Highland Park/Highwood is a club created to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster, high ethical standards; the application of service in one's personal, business, and community life; and the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through individuals united in the idea of service.

In Honor of Frank Schwermin. Frank was a well-respected hospital administrator and was chief executive of Highland Park Hospital from 1961 -1984. He was very active in the Highland Park Rotary Club and served as District Governor in 1993/1994. Before he settled in Highland Park, Frank nobly served his country as a B24 Pilot in World War II. He flew his first combat mission on D-Day. He was shot down in July of 1944 and was a prisoner of war for 9 months. Frank will always be remembered for his commitment to service, the friendship he offered, and the strong love he shared for his family. Frank Schwermin died peacefully at his home on August 11, 2018.

Grant Eligibility. As a legacy in Frank's honor, a scholarship is available for students that meet all the following criteria:

- Highland Park High School student
- Students aspiring to study in the health care field and enter the health care profession
- Community service and leadership exhibited within the school environment and in the community
- Monetary need

Instructions for Completing and Submitting the Application. Applicants must provide the following to be eligible for a grant consideration:

- Complete application;
- Two letters of recommendation which may include an educator/school administrator, employer, community leader, or community representative;
- Transcript of grades (including a GPA) as well as SAT or ACT scores. A school official must sign this section as verification of the accuracy of the information provided.
- A maximum two page essay prepared by the student detailing why the student aspires to study in the health care field, importance of community service and leadership, how they have exhibited community service and leadership, and why a scholarship is important.

Deadline for Submission: Applications must be submitted by Friday, April 5, 2019.
