New Business

New bylaws have been created by Bob Harris, based on a recommendation of Rotary International. These will be distributed to board members in April for discussion.

The financial report was distributed to board members. Revenue is about \$7,000 above last year's, due to a distribution. Revenue and expenses are about equal.

The board has agreed to propose a hardship fund, in the form of honorary memberships, for some in need. Those benefitting will only pay for their meal at the weekly club.

Re funding for grants, it will be reported at the April board meeting on potential projects. It was suggested that we partner with another Club on paying for the shipment of bikes to Lesotho.

The board is working on the hospitality suite for the District Conference.

No new business regarding Faces of Lombard in the *Lombardian* was discussed. The Board will also discuss a summer activity at the April meeting.
