ROTARY MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The individual club is the cornerstone of Rotary, where the most meaningful, grass roots work of the organization is carried out. What you get out of Rotary largely depends on what you put into it.

Involvement - As a member you will be expected to participate in club service projects and attend and support our fundraisers including the sale of event and/or raffle tickets and procurement of silent auction items, if needed.

Attendance - Regular participation is a fundamental aspect of membership since it provides the opportunity to develop close friendships and keeps you up-to-date on club, District and RI news and events and engaged in club activities. Ask us for more information regarding minimum attendance requirements and ways to earn make-up attendance credit for missed meetings.

Membership - Fees are approximately \$75/quarter that covers annual dues payable to our club, Rotary International and District 6440 and includes a subscription to *The Rotarian*, RI's monthly member magazine. Members individually pay for breakfast based on what they order off menu. Rotarians are encouraged to support The Rotary Foundation's **EREY** Program (**Every Rotarian, Every Year**) with a minimum yearly contribution of \$100 to the Annual Programs Fund billed in \$25 increments. This is included on your quarterly invoice from our club and forwarded to The Rotary Foundation in your name on an annual basis.

Participation in the club's other extracurricular and fundraising activities are additional, as are voluntary contributions to the club's weekly Fun & Frolic activity that helps defray the cost of club operations.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

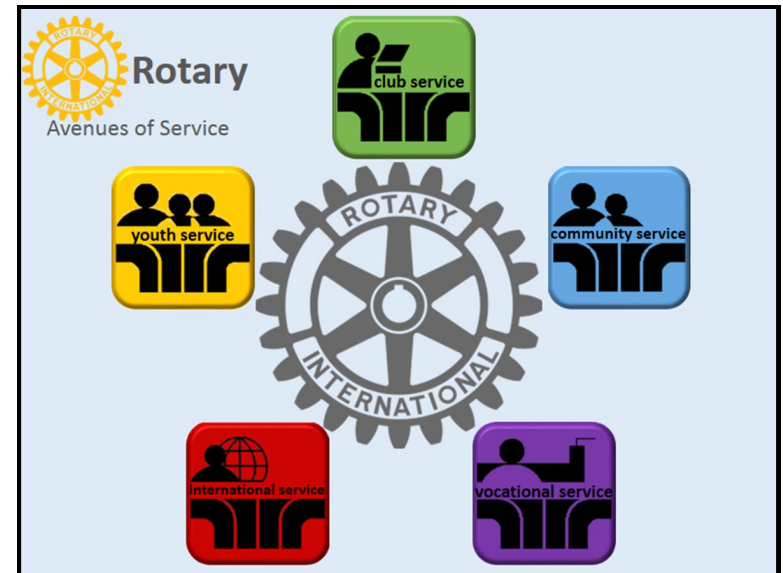


The Rotary Foundation (TRF) is a not-for-profit corporation whose mission is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty. In 1985 TRF made the global eradication of polio its top priority. At the time polio affected 350,000 people, mostly children, every year. After more than 30 years polio has been reduced by more than 99.9 percent, and after immunizing more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries against polio,

Rotary and its partners are on the brink of making history by eradicating this disease. The fight to end polio is led by the [Global Polio Eradication Initiative](#), a public/private partnership, which includes Rotary International, UNICEF, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization (WHO) and governments of the world, with the support of many others around the globe.
