What Others Are Doing - The Rotary Club of Concord, CA is located in Northern California East Bay and consists of about 90 members.



Each spring semester, for more than a decade now, a cadre of Concord Rotarians have headed back to the Mt. Diablo High School campus. Not as students this time around, but rather, as business professionals, counselors and mentors to the upper-class students in the school's International Hospitality and Tourism Academy (IHTA).

Their Mission is direct and simply stated: "to provide guidance and tools that will help students successfully transition from the classroom to the workplace". The course syllabus includes practical, effective techniques in preparing for a job interview, creating a resume and presenting oneself with confidence and appropriate body language. Their teaching method is interactive/lecture, with ample opportunities for students to practice one-on-one role play, as well as group dynamics with the Rotarians.

Where In The World Is Rotary - The Rotary Club of Berwick, Australia was chartered the 3rd of May 1961 at the Berwick Inn.

The Club contributed \$6,000 to the "Vietnam Smiles" Health Program and joined the St John of God Hospital Project Team for their 4th exercise. The team consisted of nurses, a pastoral care officer, a dentist, a teacher from St Margaret's school and a member from the Rotary Club of Berwick. The group provided a range of services such as dental work, education on hand and dental hygiene, demonstrations, logistics and general support. In appreciation the St John of God Project Team wrote: "...Your donations have assisted to improve the quality of life for people in the remote mountainous regions of Vietnam. It has certainly made a difference, not only the goods that they have received, but that people in a luckier country care enough to wish them well."
