Stand Tall is traditionally a one-day annual event at the International Convention Centre in Sydney that brings together thousands of secondary students, inspiring them to change the course of their lives and build hope for the future.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions this life-changing event is now online and accessible to ALL secondary students across Australia on 4 June 2020 - FREE OF CHARGE.

Supported by Australian Education Departments as a valuable well-being resource for schools, the Stand Tall event will be live-streamed on Thursday 4 June 2020 to secondary students at home or school.

This year Stand Tall is fully funded by the NSW and Federal Governments, making it a free and accessible tool for teachers in all schools.

This four-hour online event on June 4 can be watched by students during that school day or at a later date. All participating schools will receive access to a recording of the event to use for PDHPE and well-being classes over the following weeks. Plus ongoing teacher resources will be available on the Stand Tall website.

WHAT IS THE STAND TALL EVENT?

Stand Tall, a not-for-profit event, was established to directly address the increasingly high incidence of mental health issues in young people, with **one in four secondary students suffering from significant psychological problems.**

This event not only impacts those students who are known to be suffering, but most importantly the ones who slip under the radar - the ones who haven't verbalised their issues to teachers or parents.

Sadly 55% of secondary students in Australia don't have any hope for the future (Source: Gallup Poll 2016). Stand Tall has brought hope, resilience and a brighter future to thousands, with over 16,000 students attending the event since it's inception in 2013 and more than 65 schools bringing students back to the event each year.

With attendance numbers doubling year upon year, Stand Tall has become the largest youth event of its kind in Australia. More than 8,500 students were expected to attend the live event at the International Convention Centre in Sydney (ICC Sydney) this year, so it was disappointing that due to COVID-19 restrictions this live event was cancelled.

But that didn't mean the event couldn't take place. Now, on June 4, Stand Tall speakers will take the stage at the empty ICC Sydney and broadcast their messages of hope to Australian students via this live-streamed event.



It is more important than ever that Stand Tall takes place as an online event in 2020.

Given Australia's summer of natural disasters, and as the whole community now faces wide-reaching health and economic challenges, it's vital that strong messages of self-belief and hope are delivered effectively to young people, building their mental strength to overcome adversity.
