Alaska Day & Seward's Day

October 18, 1867.....and it's the Territory of Alaska, United States of America.

It was at 3:30pm, Alaska time the Russian Flag was lowered at the Governor's House, Fort Sitka and the American flag was immediately attached to the lanyards and raised, signifying the official transfer of **377,084,160** acres of the most beautiful land in North America. 250 US soldiers marched to the Governor's House, accompanied by Russian troops and ships at anchor in Sitka Bay. At the instant that the American flag was posted to the top, the big gun of the Ossipee fired, reverberating from the surrounding mountains. The end of 68 years of Russian rule.

Alaska was "just a waste of money" and "Seward's Folly" to most Americans. What would they do with an "icebox" way up there? It took 30 years, and then in 1897 it's **Gold!!** and the rush was on. To a little spot discovered by Joe Juneau and Richard Harris, then the next year, 1898 it was the Klondike, with the rush to Skagway and Dyea and up the Chilkoot. That same year **Gold** on the beaches of Nome, and that first shipment to San Francisco and the "Three Lucky Swedes" were rich.

The purchase actually happened on March 30, 1867, \$7.2 million in a Treasury Warrant, Number 9759, issued to Edouard de Stoeckl, Russian Minister to the United States. Negotiated by William Seward, Secretary of State of the US.

A glorious history since then, with fish, timber, minerals, oil, gas, wildlife and spell binding beauty. Thanks to William Seward for the foresight, the Alaska Natives that were here first, and the pioneers that broke trail in all directions.

Alaska Day- celebrates the transfer of the Territory to the US Sewards Day- celebrates the treaty that established the purchase.


Ask Big Al
