How to propose a member

We welcome new members, ever wondered, so what's the process?

Well, Rotary International has an established procedure, designed to be respectful of both the proposed member and the Club. So here's the steps:

- A: Qualified candidates are adults of good character & good business/professional reputation, who: 1. hold or have held an executive/discretionary position in any worthy & recognized business or profession. 2. is a community leader. 3. is retired from #1. 4. is a Rotary Foundation alumnus.
- B: Invite prospective members to lunch, introduce them to your fellow Rotarians, and see what comments/questions they have about Rotary.
- C: The Kenai Club has a requirement that a prospective member attend 3 meetings before they are officially proposed.
- D: If you determine that the prospective member is interested & meets the qualifications of membership, fill out "Part A" of the How to Propose a New Member form, available from the Club Secretary or President & give it to the President. The prospective member should not be told they have been proposed.
- E: Your proposal form will be submitted to the Board of Directors for their approval (within 30 days) & a determination of Classification by the Classification Chair.
- F: You (as proposer) are notified of the Board's decision. Following approval, you ask the proposed member to complete & sign "Part B" of the How to Propose.... form & give it to the Secretary for publication to the general membership.
- G: If no written objections are received by the Board within 7 days of publication, the prospective member is considered elected to membership & inducted.

Remember, how did you become a member?
Someone invited you.....so give it a try!
