In the picture, the young girl in braids is Shirley's niece who is helping serve. The girl in the other picture came alone, without a plate, and watched wistfully at the people eating until one of the Rotarians who noticed her borrowed the plate of someone who had finished eating and gave it to her to go through the line. I watched her stuff handfuls of spaghetti into her mouth and then go back through the line. This might have been her only real meal of the day.
