Final Water Filters Delivered in Mexico

The last 60 water filters of our Rotary International grant, that allowed us to purchase 360 of them, were delivered to a coastal village called Corrales last Wednesday. About 50 people, including Duff Pfanner, his wife Kathy Atkinson, and me and my niece, traveled an hour south of Puerto Vallarta for the 8 a.m. (yes! 8 a.m., after driving an hour) breakfast meeting of the new Rotary Club in El Tuito. There were so many of us that we couldn't fit into the restaurant where the meeting is normally held, so they set up places for 65 people on the down square and that is where the meeting was held.

After the meeting, we drove another 2 hours down out of the mountains on a steep road, most of the time dirt, that went through mud holes and creeks, to get to the village. There we made the distribution under a palapa roof on the shore, handing out 30 buckets at a time and giving the demonstration (twice, of course) on how to install the hose and filter and how to clean the filter. Duff carried some of the buckets to the distribution place and I made sure to get a picture with the first woman who received a bucket filter from our club.

Duff and I both wore our Rotarian at Work vests and I was given an opportunity to let the people receiving the bucket filters know that our club was happy to participate with the Puerto Vallarta Sur Rotary club to provide the filters. After distribution of all of the filters, the village served us a lunch that was a real Mexican experience - in a positive sense, to be sure.

Rotary "Make-Up" Rules Posted by Michelle Drew on Nov 04, 2013

In light of recent questions, the following is meant to clarify specifically what counts as a Rotary Make-Up meeting.

The RI Rule book says this: within 14 days before or after a regular scheduled meeting times

1) attend 60% of the meeting time at another club meeting

2) attends a regular meeting of the Rotaract or Interact Club, Rotary Community Corps or Rotary fellowship or of a provisional Rotaract or interact club, rotary community corps or rotary fellowship

3) attends a conventions of RI, a council on legislation and international assembly, a rotary institute for past and present officers of RI, a Rotary institute for past ,present an incoming officers of RI or any other meeting convened with approval of the board of directors of RI, or the president of RI acting on behalf of the board of directorsand so one related to RI (Rotary International)

4) is present at the usual time and place of a regular meeting of a satellite club meeting or another club purpose of attending such meeting

5) attends and participated in a club service project or a club sponsored community event or meeting authorized by the board

6) attends a board meeting or if authorized by the board, a meeting of a service committee to which the member is assigned

7) participate through a club website in an interactive activity requiring an average of 30 minutes of participations.

In addition to the above, the AER board discussed meeting make-ups at the last board meeting, and the following was generally agreed-to:

Any club "sanctioned" rotary related meeting such as: Officially scheduled club socials, Club committee meetings, Club service events, Club service projects, Club board meetings, District meetings, Foundation events, International Conventions, and other Rotary club meetings and events (such as other club foundation auction or club fundraisers). Generally, club committee meetings should be for the purpose of planning, preparing, or taking part in a club sanctions/sponsored event, in which at least three committee members need to be present, and the meeting should last for at least 30 minutes.

What does NOT count: Non-club related meetings or fundraisers where more than one rotary member happens to be in attendance, whether or not you talk about Rotary.

In order to get credit: The committee chair, social event coordinator, or other responsible party should submit the date, time, location, purpose of the meeting, and a list of rotary members in attendance. This list can be submitted to the club secretary or to Janine at a meeting or via email.

We encourage all AER members to actively participate in our club sponsored events and hope that this message helps clear up any confusion on what counts as make-up.
