Creekside Park, a 100% Title I school (100% of students qualifying for free and reduced lunches) in East Anchorage asked for our assistance to enable their children and families to participate in the Kids in the Kitchen program. This program is co-sponsored by the American Kidney Association and United Way, and is a series of cooking classes in the evening pairing volunteer restaurant chefs with kids and their families to promote good nutrition, the lifetime skill of cooking, and family fun. Creekside Park was lucky enough to get a commitment from Chef Justin Persons of Double Musky Restaurant, and several other groups have stepped up to help offset food and the slow cookers (aka crock pots) they will be using. Water Filters for Corrales

You will recall that Cliff Baker, Shirley Nelson, Bruce Phelps and I (Sandra Wicks) delivered 7 water filters and buckets from AER to the El Tuito Sunrise Rotary club the first week of January for delivery to the fishing village of Corrales, where AER had already supplied 60 filters

through an international matching grant with the Puerto Vallarta Sur Rotary club. Because the road to the coast was washed out, we left the filters with the El Tuito club to deliver later. Recently the president of the El Tuito club and several of that club's members took the filters to Corrales (a 1.5 hour drive on dirt roads). If the final three families are not located, there are three schools in other villages that need to have a filter.
