- 1. Qualified candidates for Rotary membership are adults of good character, good business and professional reputation.
- 2. An active member of a Rotary club is classified according to the member's business or profession and describes that activity.
- 3. As an active member in our club, you may wish to bring a guest to a club meeting. A guest should never be referred to as a potential member. After attending a meeting, they may wish to know more about Rotary. If an interest is shown and you believe this person would meet the qualifications for membership, you can fill out a membership proposal form.
- 4. The form (Part A) should be given to either the membership chairperson/director or to the club secretary. Don't inform a prospective member of the proposal until after Board approval.
- 5. The Board will look at the proposal at their next scheduled meeting.
- 6. The membership chairperson/director will inform the sponsor of the Board's actions.
- 7. The membership chairperson/director will have an informal meeting with the proposed member and their sponsor.
- 8. If the proposed member wishes the application to go forward it will be published in the ASR SCOOP twice.
- 9. If there are any objections by a current ASR member they should be submitted to the Board in writing, through the membership chairperson/director.
- 10. The Board will discuss the objection/s at their next scheduled meeting
- 11.If there are no objections then an induction is scheduled and the person becomes a member of the club. A Rotary pin is given at this time and their membership dues are to be paid.
- 12. The new member will meet with the membership chairperson/director and receive additional information (the club roster, a To DO list for new Rotarians). The member's sponsor is invited to attend.
