Bean's Café is one of Alaska's most wellknown not for profit organizations. Although Bean's Café provides numerous services for its client base; i.e., meals, transportation, social services and both day and night shelter, its primary mission is to provide a sense of hope for the individuals that it serves.

The clients at Bean's Café range from the working poor, working individuals who are employed but unable to make ends meet, those with mental health issues, those who migrate from rural Alaska to Anchorage (rural to urban migration), and young children who are served through Title 1 schools receiving meal gifts from the Children's School Lunch Box program.

Bean's Café is currently operating from a \$2 million budget, and is successfully serving over 600,000 per year.
