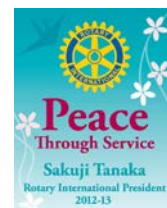

Program Speaker: Darrin E. Jones, FBI Agent, Cyber Program Manager

FBI, Special Agent, Darrin Jones has served the FBI for 15 years. The FBI currently employs roughly 34,000 individuals and 13,000 of which are special agents, and 2,000 analysts. According to Darrin, the FBI has every position that you would find in private enterprise from waiters and waitresses, to individuals who have Hollywood experience with expertise in selecting characters, and in their case who select FBI Agents with the right look to serve in various undercover capacities. The FBI currently has an \$8 billion dollar budget.

After listening to Darrin, one might have second thoughts about posting so much personal data, detail and photos on his/her Face Book page. Your innocent post of a comment or photo could possibly render you or a family member the next victim of a cyber-crime. It appears that a bit of common sense might go along way when interfacing on the World Wide Web. REMEMBER – once you make a post – DELETE REALLY DOES NOT MEAN DELETE!

- ~Protect the US against cyber based attacks and hi-tech crimes
- ~Combat public corruption
- ~Protect Civil Rights
- ~Combat trans. national/national criminal organizations entrance
- ~Combat major white collar crime
- ~Combat significant white collar crimes
- ~Support Federal, State, Local and International governments
