Scholarship Application 2021

The Homer Kachemak Bay Rotary Club is sponsoring scholarships for the 2021-22 academic year for applicants attending <u>any</u> academic institution OR vocational program, who demonstrate the vest combination of financial need, career goals and Rotary principles. A vocational program is defined as a program leading to an industry certificate, or other certificate of completion which would enable the recipient to obtain entry level career employment. This need not be in a traditional vocational area such as welding or other trade, but may include culinary arts, specialized business training, or medical training such as nursing or EMT training; it need not be a degree program.

Criteria

- 1. Applicants must have or are scheduled to receive a High School Diploma or GED prior to award date.
- 2. Applicants must be admitted to their institution/program of choice by award date.
- 3. Applicants must be enrolled in an academic institution with a minimum of 12 credits of a Workforce Certificate Program.
- 4. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.50. Verification of GPA will be made prior to disbursal of scholarship award.
- 5. Other financial awards will be considered to determine financial need for these scholarships.
- 6. Applicants may be asked by the Rotary Scholarship Committee for a personal interview.

Completed Applications Must Include:

- 1. This page signed and dated.
- 2. A completed and signed Applicant Information form.
- 3. High School transcripts or proof of GED.
- 4. A typewritten description which demonstrates:
 - a. Your community service and volunteer activities;
 - b. Your future education and career goals;
 - c. Your basis for financial need and how you intend to cover the cost of your education. Be sure to include the types and amounts of any form of financial aid for which you have applied.
- 5. Submit all forms and applications to:

- Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- Funds must be used for the academic year awarded or the scholarship will be forfeited.
