John Venables is an eleven year resident of Alaska. He was born in Pittsburgh, Pa. In 1946, at age seven, his family moved from Pittsburgh to the Miami, FL area. After graduating from Florida State University in 1962, he served in the military as an army It. from 1962-1964, where he was attached to a Pentagon intelligence unit. Most of adult life was pent in Florida in credit management and medical computer industry.

John Venables main activity since 2006 has been presenting Alaska history programs in schools, libraries, museums, senior centers, adult assisted living facilities, nursing homes and public venues.

In 2007, he received a \$5,000.00 grant from the Alaska Humanities Forum for a new program on Judge James Wickersham. In 2008, he received a \$20,000.00 grant from the Alaska Humanities Forum/Rasmuson Foundation to help cover travel expenses during the 50th Anniversary of Alaska Statehood celebration. (His time was donated for the programs.)

The latest activities of his Alaska Living History is to promote awareness of the two Alaska state holidays and the eight individuals recognized by the Alaska legislature of a Day of Honor. First Alaska Day of Honor program for the calendar year 2013, February 6th, Ernest Gruening Day.

## January is ... **Awareness Month**

RI President-elect Ron Burton will ask Rotarians to Engage Rotary, Change Lives in

2013-14. He unveiled the RI theme during the opening plenary session of the 2013 International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, the annual training event for incoming district gover-

"If we really want to take Rotary service forward, then nors. we must make sure that every single Rotarian has the same feeling about Rotary that each one of us here has today," Burton said. "We need to make sure that every Rotarian has a meaningful role to play, that they're all making a contribution, and that their contribution is valued."



Burton said the July launch of The Rotary Foundation's new grant model, Future Vision, makes it an exciting time to be a

Rotarian. He said the new grant model, which has been used by about 100 pilot districts since 2010, represents a new era for the Foundation, and will help Rotarians get excited about Rotary's ability to change lives.

"It takes everything that is wonderful about Rotary and raises it to a new level — by

encouraging bigger, more sustainable projects while providing increased flexibility for local projects, both of which address the needs of the community being served," he said.

Burton asked the incoming district governors to take the lead in helping their clubs through the transition, with the assistance of their district Rotary Foundation chairs, who also attended the assembly this year. The training sessions are focusing heavily on equipping these

leaders to go back to their districts as experts on the new grant model.
