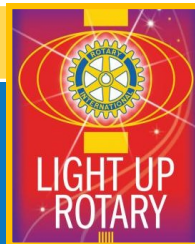

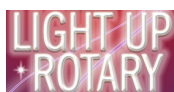


Jorden Nigro is a lifelong Alaskan raised in Gustavus. She has spent the past 15 years working in the social service field in Juneau and feels a

BOARD MEETING BRIEFS

BREWFEST III was another huge success thanks to the efforts of our club members and our partner, the United Way of Southeast. Final accounting is forthcoming.

The board approved \$1,000 to join the other two clubs, Glacier Valley and Gastineau, to put a Rotary emblem on the **Food Bank** van.

Literacy grant: At the last meeting it was decided that monies left over in this grant were going to be donated to AEYC. However, all of the expenses for the mobile book giveaway had not been covered, so the remaining amount in the grant will go toward those expenses.

A Night at Perseverance: We are now trying to get a night during the run of *Odd Couple* in March. Should it occur, the money raised that evening will be donated to Polio Plus.

Suicide prevention: The Anchorage Downtown Rotary club has district grant funds for a suicide prevention project. Lance Walters is attending the meeting at the Juneau Suicide Prevention Coalition as our liaison to see what kind of involvement might come from our club. There will be a training on Thursday, December 4th for club members to learn how to identify signs those with suicidal tendencies and how to get them help.

Haven House: the conditional use permit was approved. President Karen has emailed the committee to obtain the next steps — stay tuned for more info once the action plan has been developed.

Club Service: Glory Hole, Bell Ringing and, of course, fun & fundraising for our holiday adopt-a-family.
