typhoon flattened entire towns and villages, killed thousands and displaced nearly 600,000 people.

The situation remains dire as widespread destruction has made food, water, and medicine scarce in areas affected by Typhoon Haiyan.

Rotary President Ron Burton is urging clubs worldwide to continue to assist storm victims.

“I know we all want to help. I am urging our clubs to take action to provide emergency aid now and begin planning for the future when we can help rebuild,” Burton said.

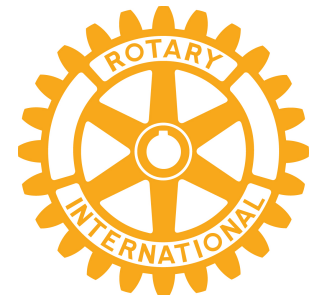
