Larry Persily serves as the federal

coordinator for an Alaska North Slope natural gas pipeline. In this role, he s h a r e s information with policy makers and the public on natural gas



projects while the agency waits to help

manage the work of federal permitting agencies for an Alaska gas line.

Before accepting the presidential appointment as the pipeline coordinator in 2010, Persily worked for more than a decade on Alaska oil and gas issues for three governors and the Legislature. He was deputy commissioner for the Alaska Department of Revenue from 1999 to 2003, and later served in the governor's Washington, D.C. office.

Before joining government, Persily worked as a journalist in Alaska for more than 20 years.


