To help these students and families, JDHS Interact started a Homeless Student Fund that provides school supplies, bus passes, toiletries, and other necessities. The Sleepout is our fundraiser for this fund. Interacters sleep outside in Alaska's November weather to help the community realize how serious an issue student homelessness is, as well as to raise money through pledges and donations. Pledges can be made based on the number of hours the kids will sleep out (maximum number of 12) or a flat donation made out to JDHS Interact.
