

Juneau Youth Advisory Committee

Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) is a group of 15 students from JDHS that operates as an extension of the Juneau Community Foundation. Each year the YAC students select a theme related to youth, such as youth homelessness, employment options after high school,

or healthy afterschool activities, and they raise funds for that objective, and then administer a grant process. The students advertise the grant availability and then review grant applications from local non-profits who are aligned with the current year's objective. They may request presentations from the applicants if they require additional information, and finally they chose the recipients and funding levels. It's very



inspiring to see their enthusiasm and sense of civic responsibility throughout the process.

This year, the students' grant focus is: "Promoting responsible outdoor recreation through youth based education and activities.

Their "wants" are few, their needs much greater as you can see below. If you are so inclined, we'll be collecting these items or any other ideas/items you might like to contribute each week at our meetings. Please bring them in and we'll get them to the Salvation Army at the end of each meeting. (And please don't worry about duplicating gifts. If we fulfill our family's wants and needs, there are so many more in need!)

We'll also be putting on a mini-food drive to supplement a full Christmas dinner. As in the case with our elf voting and the gift drive, beginning tomorrow and continuing through the 16th, we'll be collecting non-perishables to help our family with food to use during and beyond the holidays. Think of Christmas dinner fare such as stuffing mix, gravy, canned yams, instant mashed potatoes or bagged potatoes, cranberry sauce, canned vegetables, olives, pies, marshmallows, butter, whipped cream, etc. for dinner.
