DG Peggy has since been honored as a Distinguished Member of the 1-25 Stryker Brigade for her continued work with the military and their families. She is a past president of the Midnight Sun Council of the Boy Scouts of America, a recipient of the BSA's Silver Beaver Award, and was named a *Woman of*

Distinction by the Girl Scouts of the Tanana Valley.as one of their "Women of Distinction".

Peggy, a dedicated Rotarian, is a Past President of the 185-member Fairbanks Ro-



tary Club. Her extensive Rotary Club honors include the Club's Spirit Award and Rotarian of the Year. She is a Paul Harris Society Fellow, Major Donor, and Bequester. Between '08 and '11, Peggy served as the D5010 Assistant Governor for Northern Alaska, before being selected in 2011 as the DGN for D5010 in Alaska & the Yukon. Her Rotary service also includes District Conference Chair, District Rotaract Chair, and many other committee activities. In 2011 she served as a PETS trainer in Seattle.
