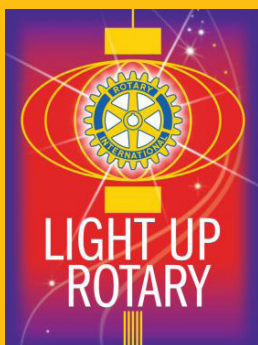

This Week's Program: Pat Pitney, OMB Director

Pat Pitney was named the Director of the Office of Management and Budget in December 2014 by incoming Governor Bill Walker.

Prior to her current position, Pat Pitney was Administrative Services since 2008 following 18 years with the University of Alaska System. Before Vice Chancellor for Administrative Services, Pitney was Vice President for Planning and Budget, where she was responsible for providing UA's planning, performance and accountability processes, and developing UA's budget request to the State of Alaska. Pitney also served as director of UA's Budget and Institutional Research and Planning offices, and managed the IT applications programming group. She taught classes at Tanana Valley Campus and has been a volunteer assistant coach for the UAF rifle team.



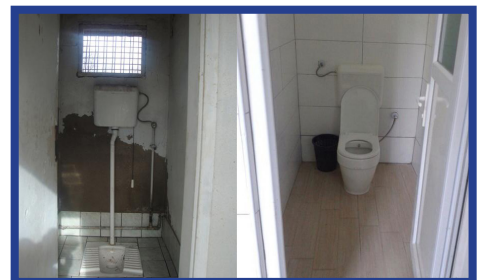
Pitney grew up in Billings, Mont., and earned an undergraduate degree in engineering physics from Murray State University (Kentucky). She competed for Murray State's rifle team from 1983 - 1987, during which time the team was a two-time NCAA national champion, while Pitney earned All-American honors and two NCAA individual national championships. A member of the U.S. Shooting Team from 1982 - 1988, Pitney won an Olympic gold medal in women's air rifle in 1984.

Pitney moved to Fairbanks in 1987 and earned an M.B.A. in 1991 from UAF. She and her husband, Randy, have three children. Randy was selected in 2008 as one of four inaugural members of UAF's Athletic Hall of Fame. The family enjoys outdoor activities and sports of all kinds.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS: COLORADO JOINS KOSOVO CLUB TO RESTORE SANITATION IN BLIGHTED LOCAL SCHOOLS

Blighted schools in the mountain city of Peja in western Kosovo are a reminder of the ethnic strife and war that ravaged this area in the 1990s.

To restore ruined sanitation facilities in some of those schools, local Rotary members recently partnered with their counterparts from Colorado, USA. Though residents have been slowly rebuilding the city's infrastructure after years of neglect under earlier governments, most resources are going to improve roads, rebuild homes, and create new businesses. Little money remains to restore the schools.
