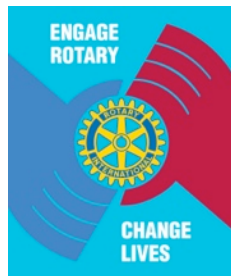
The weekend wrapped with 20 Rotarians ladling up soup at the Empty Bowls event, a fundraiser for the Glory Hole.

Nominations must be made by May 6 and can be submitted to Sally Saddler.

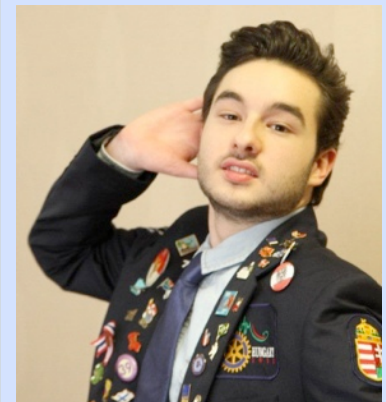
Today's program
