

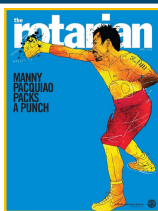

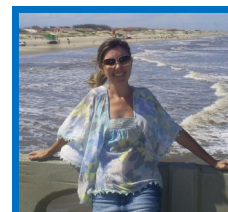
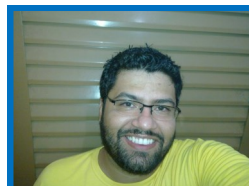

This Week's Program:

Group Study Exchange District 4470/Brazil to District 5010



Since 1965, the Group Study Exchange (GSE), a Rotary Foundation program, has provided inspiring vocational, educational, and cultural experiences for more than 70,000 men and women. In 2008, the Rotary Foundation Trustees agreed to update the Foundation's mission and encouraged all districts to align their activities with the Foundation's new areas of focus. These six areas are maternal and child health, water and sanitation, disease prevention and treatment, basic education and literacy, economic and community development, and peace and conflict prevention/resolution. As a result, for the past two years, District 5010 has participated in "single area of focus" Group Study Exchanges. Last year we exchanged with a team that focused on maternal and child health. This year's team comes to us from District 4470, a rather large district in Brazil with the focus being on water and sanitation — although all of the team members are not specifically in that field. Regardless, they are here to learn more about their US/Alaskan counterparts with the hope of bringing back the knowledge to make improvements in their communities. Since arriving in Alaska in mid-April, the team has traveled from Anchorage to the MatSu, Fairbanks, and Whitehorse. They'll be in Juneau until next Sunday when they go to Sitka, then board the ferry for a trip through the Inside Passage to Ketchikan and the District Convention. You'll get to meet and learn more about them today, but here's a sneak preview:
