The Foundation, which is named

Pianist RICHARD DOWLING appears regularly across the United States in solo recitals and concerts with orchestras. He has been acclaimed by audiences for his elegant and exciting style of playing, which earns him frequent return engagements. An artist of rising international stature, Mr. Dowling has presented solo recitals in the Far East, Australia, Africa, and Europe, including six performance tours in France. In the United States, he has received nationwide attention for recitals seen on the PBS television program *Debut*, and heard on the NPR radio program *Performance Today*.

A member of the El Dorado Hills (California) Rotary Club, Bill Tobin was a recipient of ShelterBox USA's Rising Star Award in 2012. It recognized how, within 18 months of becoming a volunteer, he made a significant impact on the ShelterBox program.

Among his efforts to raise awareness and funds was the creation of new outreach events, such as "Songs for ShelterBox," a music festival held at a winery. He also convinced the area's Rotary District Governor to make involvement with ShelterBox one of the requirements for receiving club awards.

Tobin has also been recognized by President Obama and Shel-

terBox USA with a Presidential Volunteer Service Award for his efforts—specifically, for contributing more than 500 hours of volunteer service in the last year. He and a number of other Rotarians are in Juneau as part of *Cruising for Shelter* 2013, an effort to rraise \$10,000 for ShelterBox.
