September: Wheelchair distribution trip to Colimus, Mexico. More info/dates forthcoming.

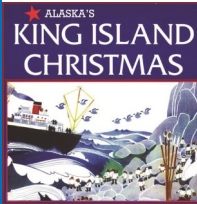

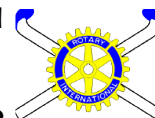

Founder Paul Harris said "*Fellowship is wonderful; it illuminates life's pathway, spreads good cheer, and is worth high price.*" In addition to the fellowship of weekly meetings and our social activities, there are also official RI Fellowships, which we've been exploring for the past few weeks. Here are a few more "Fellowships Facts" to help you determine if you'd like to be a part of one of these global, interest specific, groups:

- Each Fellowship is officially recognized by the RI Board of Directors, but operates independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure.
- Membership in fellowships is open to Rotarians and spouses, as well as Rotaractors.
- Each fellowship must maintain a membership base representing at least three different countries.
 - Each fellowship elects at least three officers to oversee the group's operations.
- Fellowships are expected to facilitate communication amongst their members and to maintain regular communication with Rotary International.
- Fellowships often use the International Convention in June as an opportunity to plan meetings and activities for attending members from around the world.
- Fellowship exhibits make up a vital part of the House of Friendship, and groups use this opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments, plan for the future, and recruit new members.

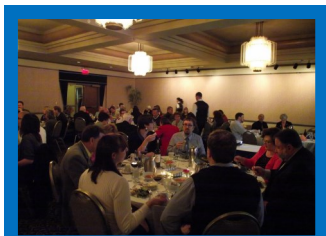
