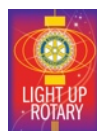

Center in Kodiak, and as chief of fisheries law enforcement for the U.S. Coast Guard from 1998 – 2002 in Washington D.C.

Cerne's final assignment was at the Coast Guard's District 17 office in Juneau, where he managed Alaskan fishery patrol operations and served on the

North Pacific Fishery Management Council, North Pacific Research Board, and a number of international fishery management organizations.

After retiring from the Coast Guard, he worked on a year-long project with the United Nations and World Bank to improve the

management of global tuna fisheries, and since 2012 has been the Executive Director for the Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute.

Cerne is married to the former Holly Hagerty of North Carolina. They have two children, Kathryn and Sarah.
