Today's Program: LARRY JOHANSEN/ALASKAN AUTHOR!

Larry Johansen has been traveling and photographing Southeast Alaska for over 50 years. Born and raised here, Larry spent a lot of time traveling through Southeast for his last job as Director of Operations for Cruise West. He has also traveled to and photographed nearly 40 countries. Author of **XTRATUF:** An Alaskan

Way of Life, his second The Alexander Eighteen: The Story of Eighteen Wilderness Areas in Alaska," examines the 18 wilderness areas that exist within the Alexander Archipelago. In the course of researching this book, he may have accomplished the feat of being the first person to have ever visited all 18!

In 1964, the Wilderness Act was signed into law. It created the most protected land designation in our country, wilderness — a place

whre man visits, but does not remain. **Fifty** vears later,
