Ken Collison has more than 40 years of senior responsibility for

mining operations and environmental affairs. Currently he provides consulting services to mining companies and is president of Collison Minecon. He is also the chief



operating officer for Ucore Rare Metals, where he is responsible for completing a feasibility study and construction of a 1,650-ton-per-day underground mine and mill. He is also a director of another mining company.

Collison served as COO of Thompson Creek Mines and Blue Pearl Mines, and was manager of the Village Safe Water Program for the state of Alaska. He has also served as vice president and general manager
