September 18: Clark Gruening & Pam Halloran Michael King, a native of Long Beach, California, came to Petersburg in the late 90s to commercial fish as a means of financing his education. He successfully completed his degree in creative writing at Long Beach State University and planned to eventually teach. Working summers in Petersburg, he met his future bride, Amber Guy King. They moved to Juneau in 2001. A few interviews in his field confirmed his annual salary teaching would be equal to what he could earn in a two-week opening. He eventually applied for an opening in the packaging department at Alaskan Brew-

ing and within two years was working as a brewer.



Michael has collaborated on several of Alaskan's unique specialty brews, including the just rereleased Baltic Porter, and the company's special 25th Anniversary release, Perseverance Ale, a Russian Imperial Stout. He puts his writing skills to good use as a nationally ranked beer judge, describing in elegant detail the tasting

and flavor notes of a beer. He speaks frequently on behalf of the brewery at beer dinners and other events, describing the brewing process, Alaskan beers and recommending food pairings.

Michael still long-lines and trolls on his time off from the brewery. He's an avid fly fisherman and hunter, surfs, and has recently discovered downhill skiing. Michael is an accomplished chef, and has received top honors at the brewery's annual cookoff. He and Amber live in Juneau with their two daughters, Mary Jane and Frejya.
