**Four Way Test** – As a Rotarian, you are expected to hold yourself to the standards of Rotary's Four Way Test of: 1) Is it the Truth? 2) Is it Fair to all concerned? 3) Will it Build Goodwill and Better Friendships? 4) Will it be Beneficial to all concerned?

**Attendance / Participation** – A Paul Harris incentive will be awarded 100% participation at meetings, fundraisers, and club events. 50% meeting attendance will also provide you points.

**Annual Dues** – Membership fees are due by the Club in January and July to Rotary International. Therefore, membership dues are \$300 annually (\$150 semi-annually).

**Meeting Make-Up Opportunities** –All Rotarians have the right to make up meetings at any other Rotary Club around the world. This provides an international opportunity for fellowship. **Rotary Foundation** – The Rotary Foundation is a foundation established by Rotary International. The Foundation funds Rotary service programs throughout the world.

**Paul Harris Fellow** – A Paul Harris Fellow is an individual who has contributed \$1,000.00 to the Rotary Foundation. They are honored with a special pin and medal, to recognize this exemplary level of contribution and commitment to serving others.

**Sustaining Member** – A Sustaining Member is a member who has contributed \$100.00 or more to the Rotary Foundation in any given year. Our Club's expectation is that **EVERY MEMBER CONTRIBUTE** *something to the Rotary Foundation Annual Program Fund.* 

Programs at the Club level are paid for by fundraisers, as well as member contributions. In addition to the cost for lunch, members are **ENCOURAGED** to also contribute to the Club in the form of the following revenue-generating programs at every meeting.

**Split the Pot** – We ask that members purchase Split the Pot tickets at lunch. 3 tickets for \$2.00 or 9 tickets for \$5.00

**Happy Dollars** – The President will circulate around the room at the end of each meeting. This is your opportunity to give \$1.00 for each thing you share with the club that you are happy for in your life.

SO....\$2.00 for Split the Pot, \$1.00 for Happy Dollars, plus the cost of your lunch. So plan on spending at least \$19.00 per meeting. More is always welcomed.

**Sergeant at Arms Fines** – During the meeting and following Happy Bucks, our Sergeant at Arms will levy fines where members have broken the silent rules: cell phones must be put on silent and will not be used during the meeting; no mention of your business during announcements; no logo wear from business; Rotary Pins and Badges must be worn; and any miscellaneous find levied in fun to support the Youth Exchange Program.

**Youth Exchange** – Each year we send a student abroad (Outbound). In addition, we receive at least one student from abroad (Inbound). These students are our surrogate children for the year of their exchange. Club members are encouraged to include our students in their daily lives whenever possible. When able, members are asked to participate as host families for a portion of the Student's stay.

**Service Projects** – Serving and giving back to others is a cornerstone of Rotary. Members are required to participate on a committee and actively participate in serving our community and world.

**Committee** – List what service committees on which you wish to participate: Membership, Fundraising, Administrative, Foundation, Public Relations, Youth Exchange, and Service.
