Divorce Attorney Michael Kelly Talks About the Health and Psychological Effects of Divorce

When it comes to Family Law and Divorce Law J. Michael Kelly has done it all and seen it all.

After receiving his JD from the University of Miami Law School in 1968 and Post Graduate Fellowship from University of Pennsylvania Law School in 1969 Mike Kelly

moved to Santa Monica, California, where he opened a practice limited to Family Law in 1969. He is Former Chairman of American Bar Custody Committee, served two terms as Chairman of CA State Bar Custody & Visitation Committee, Former Chairman of CA Trial Lawyers – Family Law Section Membership Committee, Former Chairman of California Custody Commission, served three terms as Chairman of Santa Monica Bar Association – Family Law Committee and has served over 20 years as Judge Pro Tem in Los Angeles County Superior Family Law Mediator in Santa Monica, Torrance & LA Central District Superior Courts. His many legal achievements has included Assisted in rewriting and expanding CA Civil Code 4606, "Children's right to an attorney"(1985), expanding children's rights to an attorney (Ryan). He has taught advanced family law courses and lectured across the country in subjects such as Child Custody Litigation, Division of Assets, Pre-nuptial Agreements, High Asset Celebrity Divorce, and Domestic Violence. For the past 30 years Michael Kelly has been married to a former Playboy Playmate, and has represented Playmates in divorce, many of whom were physically abused.

Michael Kelly's talk at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting on April 17 dealt with the consequences of divorce on the people getting divorced. And he seen how it has affected thousands of people in over 40 years of specializing in divorce. He said that divorce does things to each person's mind and body. Divorce is like cancer, like death. It is the death of a marriage gone bad.

Of the people getting divorced there is the "Leaver" and the "Leavee." Sometimes the "leavee" doesn't even know the divorce is happening until he or she is served papers at his or her place of work. The "Leaver" wants freedom, and when the divorce is final they take a deep breath and feel free.

Unless people have lots of money divorced people generally will have to change their life style. They have to deal with giving up things—of giving up time with their children, of giving up money, property, and things they have taken for granted. Laws governing children try to give parents joint custody. Pets are treated as chattel and may result in a real "dog fight" among the people involved.

Divorce changes the mental and physical state of people. It changes the serotonin levels in the brain. It causes headaches, and depending on the person, it can cause either weight gain or weigh loss, cause people to start or stop drinking. It can cause Crohn's disease, loose bowel or constipation, and has been known to cause esophagal cancer. Kelly cited a book written in 1955 by two psychologists, entitled *Anger Kills*, which attributed to various medical conditions, such as high blood pressure and stroke, to anger. It is usually because people are are angry with other that they get divorced. Inch by inch they are falling out of love. Their needs aren't being met by their mate. Peoples needs are different. A relationship can run its course. It is usually several things that lead to the divorce, but one last thing that may put a person over the edge—the last straw—which could be an extramarital affair, a financial problem, phyical or verbal abuse, alcohol or other substance abuse. It can be due to obsessive compulsive disorders

Not all divorces are filled with hate anger and confrontation. There are ocassions when there is a friendly divorce. The two parties agree on exactly how they want to divide their joint property and take care of their children. It is important to not lie or withold anything from your attorney.
