### Malibu Rotary Club Assembly April 30

The Malibu Rotary Club April 30<sup>th</sup> was a Club Assembly.

Briefly discussed was Kelly Sagona representing the Malibu Rotary Club at the Earth Day celebration the previous Sunday at the Malibu Country Mart. She said she met several contacts there who might be interested in Rotary.

Malibu Rotary Club President Bill Wishard had a busy week going to Indianapolis for the 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of his high school classes. The class only had 12 people and the 10 in the class are still alive were all there. Bill also had the printed bio of "William Niles Wishard III" from his recent Williams College Reunion book. In the bio Bill talks about the famous people he met while he was still a student at Williams College—and became involved with organizations promoting world peace. He met Gandhi's grandson, Presdent Ng Dinh Diem of South Viet Nam, Madame Chiang Kai-Chek, Martin Luther King, Prem Rawat, and others. Since his visits to Viet Nam he has always had a keen interest in Viet Nam—the U.S. involvement there, who was really responsible for the assassination of Diem, and a lot of history in which facts have never been discovered. While Bill was in Indianapolis for the high school reunion had, through what he described as through the "Magic of Rotary," met at the airport a fellow from Viet Nam, Khoi Pham, who is the Executive Director of company Bella Communications, that tries to provide affordable housing to people in several cities across the country, including Los Angeles and Indianapolis. When the United States withdrew its military support of South Viet Nam in 1975 Americans and South Vietnamese who were friendly toward America had to leave the country quickly or be killed. Because the runway had been bombed the best way out was by helicopter and the last one left on

April 30 1975. Bill knew this history and asked Khoi about this week's significant anniversary. Khoi, who received his B.A. of Economics Cum Laude from UCLA and also his MBA from the UCLA Anderson School of Management was very familiar with this date. He was on that last helicopter flight out of Saigon in 1975!

Most of the Rotary Club meeting had to do with future events

planned for the club and at the time of meeting plans were still being discussed for an event that will have already happened by the time you read this—the Malibu Rotary Club booth at the Fiesta Malibu on Sunday, May 4<sup>th</sup> at Juan Cabrillo School. There is a picture and story about that below.

In addition Maibu Rotary Club President Elect Margo Neal talked about several future events. Coming up this month are two major district events, the District Assembly on May 10 at the Carson Center, and the Rotary District Conference the weekend of May 16-17 in Indian Wells near Palm Springs. Margo said that since she is not going to the Rotary International Convention in Sydney, Australia, the money that was budgeted for that out of the Malibu Rotary Club budget could be used subsidize registration for Malibu Rotarians to attend both the District Assembly and the District Conference. For the District Conference members would still be responsible for their own rooms. There was some debate by treasurer Hubert over whether there was indeed enough to cover these subsidies, because the club is

already paying a majority of the cost for members attending the quarterly district breakfasts. There was also some debate on whether the club should even consider these subsidies, and in the final analysis it was agreed that these subsidies will be available to members who request them, and any who feel comfortable paying their own way for these district events should do so. Several members are attending both the district assembly (Bill Wishard, Hubert Luckerath, Griselda Espinoza, Irene Bettler, Margo Neal and David Baird) and district conference (head count to come).

There was a discussion about the charity budget—how it is very important that the club keep a separate charity budget and operating budget, but that a certain percentage of the charity budget can come from the Charity Trust account. The charity trust account has about \$51,000 in it, and to sustain it it is hoped that only interest will be taken out for charity giving, probably 5%, which would be about \$2500.

At the Club Assembly Margo will make that the Malibu Rotary Club will reserve the maximum 4 seats for the Paul Harris Rotary Foundation dinner.

Margo announced her slate of officers for the 2014-15 Rotary year, and in addition to Hubert Luckeath and John Elman continuing in their capacity as treasurer and secretary, respectively, and Maggie Luckerath as community service director and PR, Griselda Espinoza and David Zielski have positions as both co-youth directors and fund raising, Irene Bettler as vocational service director, David Baird in charge of Rotary Foundation, Bill Wishard in charge of programs, and she will call on Bob Syvertsen to deliver a weekly "Rotary Minute" history of club and/or Rotary International

Already on the job in her new position of fund raising chair Griselda announced that she has continued Donna Bohana about the use of her Malibu office building at 22741 Pacific Coast Highway for a fundraiser on October 25<sup>th</sup> for a fundraiser called "Hollywood Holloween" which will be a costume party.

Two bikes were raffled off at the Malibu Rotary Club booth:


One 20 inch "boys" bike - beach cruiser style (one speed)
