Carmen Ramos Koros and Bianca Ramos Torrence Talk About the Rosa Octavila Ramos Foundation



Sisters Bianca Ramos Torrence (L) and Carmen Ramos Koros wanted to honor the memory of their mother Rosa Octavila Ramos and did so by forming a Foundation in

her honor to help the children in the village in the mountains of Peru where Rosa taught school.



Rosa Octavila was born in Cora Cora Ayacucho-Peru on July 24, 1924. She graduated with her credential as a teacher, was assigned to the city of Churcampa, where full of energy and enthusiasm, she began her career with children.

Churchampa is an isolated village in the mountains of Peru, at an elevation of 5300 meters (about 10,000 feet) with their own culture and language. It rains there most of the year, and it is cold. Despite the isolation Rosa loved the village, the people, and especially the children, whom she never forgot, even when she left the village. A source of concern for Rosa was that the children of the village did not have enough food.

Teodomiro Ramos, native of Churcampa, was marveled by Rosa Octavila's beauty and personality.

They got married and were blessed with 8 children and a happy home.

Carmen was the eldest daughter. Churcampa had only the elementary school when Rosa's first children were born. She wanted them to have more education than they could get Churcampa, and the family moved to Lima, where her children could get a better education.

On the website http://rosaoramosfoundation.org/ she writes

"Rosa was an extraordinary person, a dedicated wife, an exemplary and loving mother, kind and caring friend, she was a pillar of faith for many. Active in her spiritual life, our Lord called her to dedicate her efforts to advise her friends, relatives and acquaintances giving them love, fortitude and courage to anyone that needed it. Rosa Octavila was an active member of the Magnificat group, in charge of the intercessory prayers. She organized other praying groups evangelizing in her community. Her examples and teachings are still a source of inspiration."

The family immigrated in 1976 to Los Angeles, California and in 2007 Rosa passed away.

To honor her mom, Carmen founded the Rosa Octavila Ramos Foundation in 2010. The website describes the foundation:

The Rosa Octavila Ramos Foundation is a public organization dedicated to raising funds to provide assistance to the underprivileged families and children of Churcampa, Huancavelica Peru. It is with the direct help of the Catholic Parish of San Antonio de Padua and the sisters of the Ministers of Charity that we partner with to provide aid relief programs assisting with the basic necessities including food, shelter and medical support to those most in need in Churcampa and the surrounding local communities.

A major objective is to provide the children with 1 nutritious meal per day. They are providing food for about 300 kids. The foundation donates about \$5000 per year. Last year they realized the kitchen was badly in need of repair and utensils needed to be replaced and they donated \$2,000 for that purpose.

Rotary Assistant District Governor **Dwight** Heikkila and wife Sook attended the August 26 Malibu Rotary Club Dwight is a meeting. member and past President of the Westwood Village Rotary Club is Assistant District Governor assigned to the Malibu Rotary Club. He will have his official visit and be the speaker at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting on September 26. It was his wife Sook who had the most interesting story to tell us this time however.

Most of us (like this writer) who have been in Rotary over 30 years remember a

time when Rotary was a men's organization. It wasn't until the Rotary Club of Duarte, California invited 3 women to be members in 1978 that females were allowed membership. It took 9 years before it was official. It took a decision handed down by the United States Supreme Court in 1987, to make it official. Prior to that the wives of the members had auxiliary organization and were called "Rotary Anns".

This designation was never one of disparagement, but rather grew out of an interesting historical occasion. The year was 1914 when San Francisco Rotarians boarded a special train to attend the Rotary Convention being held in Houston. In those days few wives attended Rotary events, and until the train stopped in Los Angeles, the only woman aboard was the wife of Rotarian Brunnier..

At the train's arrival at the Houston depot, a delegation greeted the West Coast Rotarians. One of the greeters was **Guy Gundaker** of Philadelphia, whose wife was also named **Ann.** During the rousing demonstration, someone started the Rotary Ann chant. The two petite ladies, **Ann Brunnier and Ann Gundaker**, were hoisted to the men's shoulders and parade about the hall. The group loved the title given to the two women named Ann. Immediately the same term of endearment was used for all of the wives in attendance and the name "**Rotary Ann**" was here to stay.

Oklahoma City, Club 29 is responsible for the origin of the Rotary Ann auxiliary organization. OKC Rotarian Virgil Browne's wife, Maimee Lee, proposed this organization to Club 29 in November, 1928, and its acceptance has spread to thousands of clubs throughout the Rotary world.

One of those auxiliary clubs was formed 80 years ago in our Rotary District, a ladies auxiliary to the Westwood Village Club. It is now the only surviving Rotary Ladies Auxiliary Club in the district and is very active. Sook Heikkila has been an active participant in this club, which meets monthly as a luncheon, rotating at members home, with a guest speaker each week, inexpensive dues, and with their own community projects. One of their community projects has been working with Angel Flight in helping getting needy patients to the hospital from their airport.
