Dave has recruited Ted Silverberg, who emceed the Malibu Rotary Club Middle and High School Singing Competition in January, to be emcee and also auctioneer at the Halloween fund raiser.

David later sent an e-mail summarizing discussions of the Halloween Fund Raiser:

- Check with urgent care swap dollars for medical equipment for volunteers and ticket sales

The two guests who attended the July 26 meeting of the Malibu Rotary Club were also guests at the August 2 meeting. **Jose Angel Manoizo, Jr** is a tutor (Malibu A plus Tutor) who also is a member of a group of local business people called Malibu Finest Network that meets at noon each Wednesday at the Sunset Restaurant in Malibu and **Sarah Mirembe** is a Master student at

Pepperdine's School of Public Policy. Sarah is from Uganda. Jose is from Honduras. Jose told us that when he came to this country he only could say one sentence in English, "Hi, my name is Jose." Since he's been here has learned to speak English fluently and went to UCLA, where he ultimately became a tutor for scholar-athletes. Among the students he tutored while at UCLA were this year's NBA MVP Russell Westbrook and tight end Marcedes Lewis, who was a 2006 first round draft pick of the NFL Jacksonville Jaguars, where he will starting is 12th year.

ROB'S RUN - AUGUST 5-7, 2017

Playa Venice Rotarian Rob DeCou is racing from Death Valley to the portal of Mt. Whitney to raise funds to End Polio Now

Playa Venice Rotarian Rob DeCou will be running from the Badwater Basin in Death Valley to the portal of Mt. Whitney from August 5-7, 2017 in an effort to raise funds for End Polio Now.

"One of my passions in life and an organization I owe a great deal of gratitude for my personal and professional growth is Rotary International. As a member of the Playa Venice Rotary club I was able to join forces with District 5280 in Los Angeles and with the leadership of Rotary District Governor Cozette Vergari have come up with a goal and a plan to raise over **\$250,000** that will go towards the **End Polio Now** campaign. This financial goal takes advantage of the extremely generous hearts of the Rotary community while also leveraging the Rotary Foundations matching grants and most significantly the 2-1 matching grants from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation that have been instrumental these last few years to helping ride Polio from the face of this planet."

Badwater Basin is known as the lowest point in North America at 282 feet below sea level and near the spot where the hottest temperatures on the planet was recorded: 134 degrees in 1913. Badwater and Whitney Portal are located about 135 road miles from one another. Drive time is about 2 in a half hours, run time for Rob is approximately 60 hours. Elevation at the Whitney Portal is 8,361 feet, and the Mt. Whitney Summit a short 11 miles switchback trail away with an elevation of 14,508.

Rob "Lionheart" DeCou will be joined in the run by two fellow ultra runners and incredible Native American athletes Maria "Mariposa" Walton, and David "Alapatwu – Running Deer" Nelson. For moral support and encouragement a group of Rotarians will also be joining along the route across Death Valley as well as at locations around Los Angeles on Monday evening around 6:00pm to celebrate the finish of this event. Australian Samuel Osborne is a Researcher, Educator, Speaker & Author. As we learned when he first spoke to the Malibu Rotary Club Sammy has many other talents and is very entertaining.



He has just publiched a new book, "Pack a Bigger Punch, 7 Steps to Uncover Your Real Message"? Due for release Aug 21st. He is having a book launch on Monday 21st August at 730pm in North Hollywood.

Sam explains, "The central idea of my book is, 'you have a message within.' A message to share with the world in your own unique way. The book is written with Entrepreneurs and Speakers in mind. My talk will preview the 7 steps to uncover your real message. "In the talk, I refer to 'a real message' as a musical instrument played by master. The musical instrument can express into sound the depths of the master for an audience. Similarly your real message expresses the depths of your value for your audience. "

Prior to commencing his speaking career, Samuel was a Living Statue Performer, an elementary School Teacher, and Professional Beatboxing and Sound FX Artist. Has published a science fiction novel, interviewed over 100 creative thinkers for his podcast, Think Like a Thought Leader. In 2015, Samuel was a Finalist for Arthur Garvey Speaker of the Year Competition in Australia. Samuel's personal interests are astrophysics, comparative mythology and dream interpretation.
