Special presentation of checks to recipients of Malibu Rotary Club Halloween Fundraiser

The Malibu Rotary Club distributed checks to 3 Malibu non-profit organizations at its weekly meeting on December 17th. The money came from the profits of the club's successful October 24th Halloween Fund Raising event, which raised over \$5,000.

It was agreed that the split of that net income would be distributed as follows:

Rex and Friends Foundation, 60% (\$3,253.45), Malibu Youth Football Team 15% (\$813.36), and Malibu Sharks Youth Surf Team, 15% (\$813.36). The remaining 10% went into the Malibu Rotary Club's charity account.

About the recipient organizations:

Rex & Friends Foundation:

Based on the transformation in the life of blind, autistic, musical savant Rex Lewis-Clack, who only was able to communicate when he was introduced to music at age 2, this foundation recognizes music as a therapy and communication tool for blind and autistic children and adults, often changing the lives and reaching people that seem lost to socialization.

Malibu Youth Sports:

Michael Bonewitz started this project with his own money, creating organized youth football in Malibu when there had been none for many years. He has 47 kids ages 6 through 14. divided into two teams. 50% of the kids are on scholarship--Mike tries not to turn anyone away because they can't afford a uniform. He says the kids participating in the program are not just learning the game of

football, they are learning life skills, discipline, and being part of a team where everyone has a responsibility. They play against teams which are generally more talented than they are, but the coaches from the other teams often talk to Mike's players after the game, telling them that even though they have lost the game, they have won the other team's respect.

Malibu Sharks Surf Team:

80 boys and girls from Malibu Middle School and High School--from 6th to 12th grades--are out on the beach at 6:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, to be part of this first year program, which is not associated with the school, except as a club. No kid is turned away from this program, whether they have a boogie board or a long board. 40 parents have been certified in CPR, and have noted how participants have gained self confidence and have improved their grades at school by being part of the Malibu Sharks Surf Team, which competes against kids from about a dozen other schools.

Besides our regular winter time guest PDG **Tom Bos** from Holland, MI, and new Malibu Honorary Rotarian Malibu Chronicle editor **Veera Mahajan**, two other guests included **Ross Armatage** (not sure of spelling) and **Hans Laetz**, who announced he was launching a new Malibu based 100 watt FM radio at 97.5. Hans is a veteran newsman who spent three decades in print, TV and radio, and invested hundreds of hours of personal time in a solo effort to win tougher safety standards on utility poles after the disastrous 2007 Malibu Canyon wildfire. For this he was a 2013 Dolphin Award winner. He told us new metal poles (still above ground) will soon be installed on Malibu Canyon Road.

Malibu Rotary—Home Club of RainCatcher Executive Director David Zielski

Every 21 seconds, a child dies from a water-related illness. Women and children spend 200 million hours a day collecting water.

There are over a billion people who do not have access to clean drinking water. RainCatcher is efficiently doing something to try to reduce that number. They get low cost, low maintenance and sustainable water systems to Uganda and Kenya so women and children have a safe and close water source.

Besides the obvious health benefits, providing a local and safe water source multiple other social, economical, and educational benefits also accrue. There can be an increased girls' school attendance, level of education and literacy rates, as they no longer need to miss school to secure water for their families and have adequate and separate sanitation facilities. There can also be reduced physical injury from constant lifting and carrying heavy loads of water, reduced risk of rape, sexual assault, and increased safety as women and girls do not have to go to remote and dangerous places to defecate or to fetch water during the night.

The Malibu Rotary Club along with the Rotary Clubs of Beverly Hills, CA USA and the Rotary Club of Entebbe, Uganda has applied for a Rotary Foundation Grant to assist Raincatcher. There are several videos available on You Tube that show the amazing things Raincatcher is doing bringing clean drinking water to places in Uganda and Kenya where there was previously no clean drinking water.

David Zielski, Executive Director of Raincatcher, makes regular trips to Uganda and Kenya to do Raincatcher installations and maintenance. The latest video showing what David and the Raincatcher people are doing was shown at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting on August 20. A link to the video is now on the Maliburotary.org website.
