Rotary Singing Competition Steps

Steps to put on a successful show

- 1 contact Chris Bauman -Pepperdine previous Rotarian -<u>chris.bauman@pepperdine.edu</u> He will cover expense
 of hall with his budget
- communicate directly with rep for Hall 2017-2018 Paul Vacchiano paul.vacchiano@pepperdine.edu -make sure of date and time, mic, piano and tables, parking spots, banner placement.
- communicate with Music teacher Malibu High 2017-2018- Krysta Sorensen ksorensen@smmusd.org regarding date and organizing 17-18 children
- Speak to principle Dr. Nye about event make sure it gets in Monday message and on school website.
- Decide on whether to charge at door or ask for donations
- If asking for donations, have clear plan of action on how it will be done. Announce to everyone in advance along with invite so people are prepared to donate the night of event.
- Set some \$ aside for accompanist for singers ex: Cha Cha \$200 was given to her for 2018
- email judges with invite letter- attached above with map and details of event
- communicate with MC Ted Silverberg Ted@malibuinsurance.biz
- Arrange date with Paul, Ted and judges
- Make sure bio's are done for all judges, MC, accompanist, teacher, etc. for intro.
- order plaques Camarillo Mark it place http://www.themarkitplace.com/ -
- Organize parking spots for judges, MC, Media and Chairperson of event
- suggest gathering with judges, MC, Chair, media at Burger Fi or something casual prior to event 4:30-5:00pm until 6pm
- Prep a Press Release for Malibu times/ Surfside news and LA times possibly of significant players and story line. Be very clear with media what we would like the theme of the event to be as well as who is involved with their names and details.
- contact Barbara Burke of Surfside news <u>barbara.burke@pepperdine.edu</u> and Malibu Times
- · Social media marketing of event and follow up with pics on FB- Instagram Website
- Decide on how the judges are to judge to prevent lengthy deliberation
- Have Rotaractors help with table manning as well as distribution of meeting invites Photographer Have them set up of back room for judges with food and water
- · Get snacks of cheese, crackers, sweets, fruit, waters for judges, MC
- Make sure to thank all judges, MC, teacher and pianist
- Print judging sheets use logo Be the Inspiration- make sure all judges know how the marking is done -- 1 final mark no need to calculate on our end -
- Print seating reservations with names
- print program with participants names from teacher at HS
- · Print Meeting invites and Donation banner for jar

- Have Rotarian bring door hook for banner Make sure banner can go on stage
- have donation bowl and sign set up
- Create Thank you letter for judges
- · Ask for suggestions from judges on improvements
- Arrange 2 people to tally marks of judges and have them tally middle school at break and then HS at final Make sure they have calculators
- · Be sure the helpers who tally marks are aware how to tally Add all the marks and the top marks win -
- Get judging sheets from judges at 5 min break to tally Middle School winner
- · Have judges and students perform a final song at end while marks are tallied for High School competitors
- Have photos taken of all contestants with Teacher, Pianist, Judges, Chair person, MC and also winners separately as well as group of 6 and then with judges.
- save all receipts for ink, food, paper from printing, Plaques
- Email thank you's to Judges, Ted(MC), Pepperdine help and Rotaractors.

Newton Lee is an author, educator, and futurist. He will speak about anti-aging research and the human trials of immune system regeneration for health and longevity.

Lee is the chairman of the California Transhumanist Party, president of the 501(c)(3) Institute for Education, Research and Scholarships, and adjunct professor of Applied Computer Science at Woodbury University.

Previously Lee was the founder of Disney Online Technology Forum, creator of AT&T Bell Labs' first-ever commercial artificial intelligence tool, and inventor of the world's first annotated multimedia OPAC for the U.S. National Agricultural Library.

Lee has published extensively including 10 academic books as well as dozens of journal and magazine articles including the International Journal of Computers in Biology and Medicine.
