Rick Johnson, "In the Pursuit of Happiness"



Geoff Ortiz, who besides being double past president of the Malibu Rotary Club, and chair of so many club projects over the years, is president of the Malibu Rotary Stage Company. He met Richard Johnson while Geoff was chairing the Malibu Rotary Club Golf Tournament some years ago. As an actor and acting teacher, Geoff asked Richard to join him on the board of Malibu Stage. The actor is now also the founder of the Malibu Stage Company's resident repertory company, and he was the featured speaker at the January 14, 2009 meeting of the Malibu Rotary Club. His short, funny, and emotional presentation showed what an actor strives for "In the Pursuit of Happiness". At the time of his presentation Richard was growing a beard for his role in Shakespeare's *Mabeth*. Richard said he always wanted to be an actor, and was a theater major at Ohio State University. While he was there he did summer stock wherever he could at theaters in the Midwest. This included musicals in which he was called upon to sing and dance. He said he never was trained as a dancer and in one of these summer productions they put him in front, where he couldn't hide his dancing inability. Instead of trying to do the called for choreography he just made up his own thing and "acted like an idiot." He said the director loved it, and began a career of "acting like an idiot." He said he believes that everyone should strive for those things in life that make them happy. He said he has been fortunate as an actor, because he got the first professional role he tried out for , and he loves everything about acting. He said one of his favorite moments and important life messages from a play occurs in the screenplay *Dead Poets Society*.

Set in 1959 at a conservative and autocratic boys prep school, it tells the story of an English teacher who inspires his students to change their lives of conformity through his teaching of poetry and literature. The story is set at the fictional Welton Academy in Vermont The script was written based on the author's life at Montgomery Bell Academy, an all-boys preparatory school in Nashville, Tennessee. On the first day of class, the students are introduced to their overwhelming and extraordinary curriculum by sullen headmaster Gale Nolan (Norman Lloyd). However, their new English teacher John Keating (Robin Williams) first lesson is unorthodox by Welton standards, whistling the 1812 Overture and taking them out of the classroom to focus on the pictures of former Welton students in a trophy case. He tells them as they look at the pictures of those students in his class who are looking at the photos. Their eyes are full of hope. He tells them to lean closer to the trophy case and the pictures. Can you hear what they are telling you? "*Carpe diem*" (Latin for 'seize the day', is what they are telling you. So seizing the opportunities of the day is a major part of the "Pursuit of Happiness."

Richard is very excited that for the first time there are enough Malibu Stage Repertory works to present a full season. Malibu Rotary Middle and High School Singing Competition—January 29th at Malibu High School

Geoff Ortiz has been in contact with the new choral director at Malibu High School—Amy Lock. He has confirmed we will be conducting our annual Malibu Rotary Middle and High School singing competition on Thursday, January 29, 2009 at 7:00PM at the Malibu High School Auditorium. Malibu Rotarians will vote on the winners. As in previous years awards of \$250, \$150, \$100, for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd voted finishers in the high school and middle school groups will be awarded.

What is unique about this year's event is that because we are having in January (as opposed to June in previous years) the winner of the Malibu Rotary High School music competition can advance to our Rotary District 5280 2009 Governors Music Award Competition. The entry must be submitted by FEBRUARY 1, 2009. The Malibu Rotary Club will pay a \$50 entry fee for the Malibu High School winner to advance to district. Auditions will be held on March 21, 2009, and the Awards ceremony will take place on May 2nd, 2009 at the Rotary District Conference at the Westin Hotel, South Coast Plaza. Winners at this level receive \$1,000 for first, \$500 for second, and \$250 for third place.
