

It is with great sadness that I have to report to you that our dear friend and District Governor Elect Jim Dyer suffered a massive medical episode the night of Friday, January 11th and has passed away. He was attending a Rotary event when this occurred and his wife Sharen, was notified immediately at home. Please keep DGE Jim and Sharen in your thoughts and prayers during this very difficult and sad time.

Service information has now been officially confirmed with the family and is as follows. The service will be held graveside outdoors at the Woodlawn Cemetery in Santa Monica (1847 14th St. Santa Monica, CA 90404) this Friday, January 18th at 12noon with a 1pm interment to follow. ## Other News And Guests from Last Malibu Rotary Club Meeting

There were several visitors at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting on January 16<sup>th</sup> and each had a story to tell. One was **Alejandro Sangiovanni** the Argentine born Past President of Pepperdine Rotaract Club (2008-2009) who told us that after graduating from Pepperdine he went to Law School for a year then worked for a software company in the healthcare industry before deciding to move to Austin, Texas where a Pepperdine classmate now lives and where business prospects

look better. We recall that when Alejandro, who is called Alex, was living in the dorms at Pepperdine as an undergraduate, one of his roommates had gone to Senegal in Africa to help teach English. One of the people who he taught was a man in his 30's named Assane Paye who asked the roommate to help fill out a paper to enter the lottery to become an American citizen. The roommate thought he was just completing an exercise that would never be used—part of the application asked for an American sponsor and the sponsor's contact information. The roommate put in his own name and contact information. One day the roommate got a call from someone with a thick French accent who was calling from LAX. "I won and I am here." The three roommates had to figure out how they were going to fit Assane into their dorm room. Ultimately other accommodations were found and Assane, who was a math teacher in Senegal, enrolled in English classes at Santa Monica College.

Another visitor was brought by Malibu Rotarian Pompeya Monteros. She brought **Felix Guevara**, her cousin from Ecuador. The circumstance of his being at the meeting, and even being in the country, was interesting. When he originally tried to get a Visa to come to the US he was denied. It turns out that Felix' nephew works for the police in Ecuador and helped apprehend someone that had killed an American. American consulate in Ecuador had told the nephew if he ever needed a favor to just ask. And so he was granted a Visa, but for only 10 days. That was not enough time to visit all that he wanted to see. Felix flew from Ecuador to Panama, where he asked for another Visa to come to America. How long do want? 6 months. OK. He is only staying 20 days but sometimes, as they say in Rotary, you have to ask.

At the meeting the Malibu Rotary Club voted to pay the \$200 registration fee for Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar Livia Govania at the Peace Conference in Hawaii. After the meeting her host sponsor Margo Neal told Livia which prompted Livia to e-mail this editor:

Hi

Margo told me that you lovely people voted to support my trip to the Global Peace Forum by paying my registration fee :-) That is so nice, I am so thankful! I don't know if you can do that, but could you include some words in your next newsletter to let the others know that I would like to express my deepest thanks for you all being so kind to me? I cannot find word to express how happy I am to have you in my life. That makes the entire "study abroad" experience so much special. Thank you! Livia
