David Zielski Talks About His Latest Trip to Africa for Raincatcher



Besides presiding over a Malibu Rotary Club Assembly and Malibu Rotary Club board meeting on January 20^{th} Malibu Rotary Club President David Zielski, who is Executive Director of Raincatcher showed a new video made on his latest trip to Uganda and Kenya on Africa for Raincatcher (picture above is from earlier trip).

David flew to the Entebbe Airport, and had to travel many miles on dirt roads to reach the remote villages where Raincatcher either were or were going to be.

During the latest trip the Raincatcher group installed new systems and checked on and repaired, as needed, previously installed systems. Because of the simplicity of Raincatcher systems they require minimal repair, and Raincatcher guarantees them for 10 years. 92% of previously installed Raincatcher systems are working. This is much higher than wells, which require much more maintenance.

In general Raincatcher storage tanks are put at the at the schools, and the students take the water clean water from the schools home to their families.

The new video is still undergoing editing and cannot currently be seen on line. Earlier videos can be seen at the RainCatcher website RainCatcher.org.

Since 2004, RainCatcher has been providing clean drinking water solutions to Africa and now other parts of the world. Currently, its systems have been setup in Kenya, Uganda, India and Haiti. Their hope is to diversify and spread across the globe to other third world countries that need clean drinking water as well. One of its main mission's focuses is on education.

In the villages that Raincatchers services the children had to travel miles each morning to bring water from streams carrying 5 gallon pales. They missed school and the water they brought back was dirty. People in these villages had never seen clean water. They thought water was brown.

Since its founding in 2004, RainCatcher has donated more than 12,000 water filtration systems and equipped 46 schools with rainwater harvesting systems in Uganda and Kenya, providing clean water to more than 450,000 people.

Rotary Peace Conference

Bill Wishard represented the Malibu Rotary Club at the Rotary Peace Conference held January 15-16 in Ontario, California. Both current Rotary International President K.R. Ravindran, and immediate past RI President Gary CK Huang were also there, along with speakers and representatives from around the world. There were also members of CIA and FIB, who talked about the San Bernadino terrorist attack.

The mission of the Rotary World Peace Conference 2016 was to bring together experts with solutions to major issues that are occurring in our personal lives, homes, schools, businesses and communities, not just in Southern California, but around the world. Leaders from health care, academia, government, public safety, religions, business, and communities to met together to share the solutions presented by experts. The format was to allow for action plans to be developed such that real and measureable actions can be undertaken when attendees return home.

The event featured more than 80 panel and facilitated sessions, five plenary sessions, World class speakers and facilitators who spoke on more than 13 different tracks of training in the field of conflict prevention and resolution.

Among topics discussed was inner peace and to this end Sally Formosa, wife of Malibu Rotarian Peter Formosa, had a room set up for meditation.

There was a sold out dinner that Bill didn't have tickets for. Bill managed to get into dinner room after he met a guest from Mexico who gave Bill as a wallet and Bill went to his car to give this guest one of the Special Olympics World Games t-shirts (Bill keeps selling these shirts and getting them back). After Bill managed to get into room where the dinner was being held he noticed there were several empty seats, ostensibly for people who bought dinner tickets but did not attend. One of the empty seats was next to Past District Governor Elsa Gilham, who invited Bill to set next her.

The Peace Conference ended with a concert. It featured a group a large string ensemble from Sakha (Yakutia) near Russia. Bill managed to get his picture with them. Bill of course is in the mddle of everything. State Ensemble of violinists of Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) "Virtuosos of Yakutia" The ensemble consists of 12 violinists. They are the winners of four International Youth Competitions "Violin of the North" in Yakutsk, the open competitions of young violinists of Siberia in Novosibirsk

Deanell Reece Tacha, Dean Pepperdine School of Law Feb 10, 2016 Latest News From the Pepperdine Law School

Dean Tacha is the Duane and Kelly Roberts Dean of the School of Law and professor of law. She was appointed by President Reagan to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit where she served as a circuit judge from 1986-2011. She served as Chief Judge from January 2001 through 2007. Dean Tacha earned her bachelor of arts degree from the University of Kansas in 1968 and her juris doctorate from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor in 1971. She was a White House Fellow (1971-1972).

She returned to the University of Kansas where she served as associate professor at its School of Law from 1974-1977 and as professor of law from 1977-1985. She served as associate dean from 1977-1979, as associate vice chancellor for Academic Affairs from 1979-1981, and as vice chancellor for Academic Affairs between 1981-1985. In 1992, Dean Tacha received the KU Alumni Association's Fred Ellsworth Medallion for extraordinary service to the university and received its most prestigious award, the Distinguished Service Citation, in 1996. In January of 2010, she was named "Kansan of the Year" by the Native Sons and Daughters of Kansas.

Rockwell is noted for his 64-year relationship with the Boy Scouts of America (BSA), during which he produced covers for their publication *Boys' Life*, calendars, and other illustrations.
