Other News And Guests from Last Malibu Rotary Club Meeting

The breakfast meeting at Tra di Noi boasted the largest attendance of club members in the past year. In addition there were several guests, including John Elman's wife **Lee Ann**, **Matti Evans**, a financial recruiter that Maggie met Kristy's, **PDG Tom Bos** and wife **Jane**, who are often winter visitors at our club from Holland, MI.

Although we had no designated speaker at the January 23rd meeting, Tom Bos gave the Malibu Rotary Club members and guests information that most of us long time members were not aware of about future changes in the Rotary Foundation will distribute money donated to the foundation.

We all knew that it is through the Rotary Foundation that most of the major projects of Rotary International are funded. These included the Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship projects, which

is the largest scholarship program in the world, the various humanitarian projects dealing with provided clean drinking water to third world countries, polio eradication, and thousands of other programs. The question came up as to how the Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship was funded. Scholarship applicants apply to individual Rotary Clubs and Rotary Clubs submit the applicants to their local district, and that will not change. Currently each district is given money from the international Rotary Foundation in Evanston, Illinois to fund one Rotary scholar, which costs about \$20,000. If the district has raised extra money they might sponsor more than one scholar. Starting next Rotary year (July 2013-June 2014) the Rotary Foundation will give to each district a sum of money to fund all the district's project—it won't be earmarked specifically for Rotary Ambassadorial Scholars. When the district leaders decide where the Rotary Foundation money will be spent they can put more or less money into funding the Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship program Most people think less will go to that program, because the cost of it, compared to health, hunger, clean drinking water, etc. is so great compared to the few people (mainly the scholars) who benefit from it.

Jim was an official ShelterBox Ambassador for the greater Los Angeles area and was recognized by President Obama with a Presidential Volunteer Service Award in March 2012 for his volunteer efforts during 2011 to provide shelter, warmth, and dignity for survivors of natural and other disasters worldwide. Jim and his wife Sharen instantly fell in love with the concept of ShelterBox during their trip to the Rotary Convention in Copenhagen in 2006 and two years later he had become a ShelterBox Ambassador for the LA area. ShelterBox started as a project from one Rotary club in the U.K. and in Jim's words, "it was incubated out of Rotary but has become a separate stand alone effort". The program provides travel grants for teams to exchange visits in paired areas of different countries. For four to six weeks, team members experience the host country's culture and institutions, observe how their vocations are practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

On Saturday March 9th there will be a special Rotary tour of Camp Pendleton to honor the Marines. A free bus has been chartered which will hold 60 people and leave from the Hawthorne Recreation Center.
