## July 13 Club Assembly Features Ideas from Guests

The Malibu Rotary Club meeting of July 13<sup>th</sup> was supposed to be a club assembly led by Malibu Rotary Club President Kevin Boling, who was going to lead the club in discussions about what



the Malibu Rotary Club is doing during the new Rotary year. There were many topics to be discussed, including membership development, Malibu Rotary Club participation in the annual Labor Day weekend Malibu Kiwanis Club Chili Cook Off event, a Malibu Rotary participation in a showing of new General Motors cars, a contribution from the Malibu Rotary Club for the International Children's Surgical Foundation to be listed as a contributor on the http://smiletrek.org/ website as last week's speaker Marine Sgt Winston Fiore travels across the country, where the Malibu Rotary Club is going to meet in August, since the only day the normal meeting place of Pepperdine Fireside Room will be available is August 10<sup>th</sup>.

As it turned out President Kevin never made it to the meeting, and for the second week in a row Malibu Rotary Club

Immediate Past President Chris Bauman presided over the meeting. Chris also handed out large grapefruit that he had brought back from his grandfather's ranch in Sonoma County when he was there over the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend. He explained that the dark spots on the outside peel are from sun exposure, the fruit is still good inside.

Most of the meeting was devoted to ideas about membership recruitment. Some of the best ideas and discussion came, not from club members, but from the two guests, who attended this club assembly. One of the guests was a familiar face, **Nichola Lenehan**, who has come to many of our recent meetings, but who has not committed herself to actual membership because she is looking for a job in her field of Information Technology, and she isn't sure where a new job might take her. She said it was important to have membership goals. When we thought about a number, it seems that at least 20, was a number that people felt reasonable. That seems to be the minimum for a small Rotary Club. There was a time when the Malibu Rotary club had 40 or 50 members, but it was generally felt that that number was currently not realistic in today's world. Nichola also said one needs to be careful how potential membership candidates are referred to—not to call them targets as much as someone we would like to engage or invite to a meeting. Their invitation to join would be to "Revitalize our organization."

The other guest, who had a lot of input was **John Miller**, who is Vice Chancellor in charge of Advancement at Pepperdine University, as well as a member of L.A. 5 Rotary Club and a former member of the Rotary Club of Santa Monica. He talked about the differences between membership in both of the two larger district clubs--LA 5 and Santa Monica. He said the membership in LA 5 has been falling. It has about 450 members on the roster, but only about 110 attend meetings. The Santa Monica Rotary Club has had a rather constant number of members, much less than LA 5, but the same number of members attend meetings as LA 5, about 110. He said that the Santa Monica Club looks at various classifications, occupations, that are currently not in the club. Then they seek to fill the vacant classifications. When they identify someone in that business classification in the community they ask their current members who knows that business person. They have the member who is familiar with that person ask the potential member to come to a meeting, and if it is agreed be the membership committee and the members at large that this person would be a good member the members say, "How would you like to be our [fill in name of classification]." It is the traditional Rotary business networking

approach, with only one business classification, in each club—one banker, one newspaper publisher, one family practice physician, one elementary school principal, etc.

Once the candidates for membership are determined there was a consensus that there should be a specific event that the potential new members should be invited to that would describe what the club does, and what Rotary International does. Certain materials, media, that Rotary International has already put together could be used for such a presentation. Senior Assistant DG Dean Reuter, who it the District Membership Chairperson, should be contacted for ideas and materials. In addition, David Baird volunteered to check the RI website for appropriate membership material that could be downloaded—PowerPoint presentations, videos.
