Malibu Rotary Club President Margo Neal Tell Members to Prepare of District Governor Elsa Gilham's Official Visit on August 20th



Malibu Rotary Club's scheduled speaker for July 23 was a supposed to be a polio survivor who was in town this week only to go to the weekends Malibu Arts Festival. She had to cancel at the last minute because of family health problems. Malibu Rotary Club President Margo Neal, who took time out from her travel schedule to attend the July 23 Malibu Rotary Club meeting, was going to call for a special board of directors meeting after the regular meeting to talk about Rotary District Governor Elsa Gilham's official visit. Instead Margo was able to turn the regular club into a Club Assembly/Board of Directors meeting.

In previous years there has always been ample time and preparation for the official District Governor's visit. Generally the DG's official visits have been posted on the Rotary District Website calendar months in advance. This year the Rotary District Website Calendar only shows 2 Rotary District Governor visits, the first one on July 29 to the Koreatown Rotary Club, and the last one on November 8th, the District Governor's home club, the

Wilshire Rotary Club. That is 2 out of 62 club visits that are supposed to take place, yet none of them are shown on the Rotary District Calendar.

Most clubs, including the Malibu Rotary Club, schedules its speakers months in advance. The

LA 5 Rotary Club probably schedules its speakers a year in advance. During the official Governor visit the program is the district governor. There is no time for another speaker Not only does the governor tell the members of the Rotary Club what is going on in the district, and bring a message from the Rotary International President, the officers of the individual Rotary Club meet with the DG (usually before the regular meeting) to find out the goals of the club. The Malibu Rotary Club had a speaker scheduled for August 20th. (After finding out at the July 23 meeting that the DG official visit was going to be August 20th the original August 20th speaker, Carl Christman, was rescheduled for August 27th).

So at the July 23th Malibu Rotary Club meeting Margo talked about several things that the Governor wanted during her official visit, which we found out for the first time, was going to be on August 20th.

There will be a meeting with DG Elsa prior to the regular meeting, which we decided will be at 10:45 a.m. in Room EC 116 in Villa Grazadio. At this earlier meeting club officers will give reports to the DG. Margo sent e-mails to the club officers after the July 23rd meeting listing what should be in those reports. These reports will only be about 3 minutes each. We will get our lunches after the preliminary meeting and start our regular meeting at noon on August 20th, open to all, and that is when the District Governor will deliver her speech.

Generally at the District Governor visit the Rotary Club makes a donation to the Rotary Foundation in honor of the DG. Margo wondered if we might give our "Happy Dollars" fund. There is around \$400 in that fund. Bill Wishard made a suggestion that we should specify that the what we give should go into the RI Foundation Polio Plus account, that way it will be matched by 3 times, and that we donate \$333.00 which would actually be like a \$1000 contribution. Bill's reasoning: At the RI Convention in Lisbon last it was announced "Going forward, the Gates Foundation will match two-to-one, up to US\$35 million per year, every dollar Rotary commits to reduce the funding shortfall for polio eradication through 2018."

Other News and Guests at the Last Meeting

Other matters discussed at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting July 23, had to do with future club events. Although Chair of the October 25th "Hollywood Holloween" Malibu Rotary Club Fundraiser Griselda Espinoza was not this meeting **David Zielski** said we ought to reconsider the venue of this event and therefore even the date. Currently the venue was supposed to be rooftop patio of a building on PCH. David said the weather is unpredictable in October—for an outdoor event we will need a large tent which will cost over \$1000. Because of this, permits, parking issues, etc., he suggested we have it at a different menu. A suggested alternative is the Malibu West Beach Club, which we could get for much less costs, and no permits needed. We apparently could not get Saturday October 25th—it is a popular venue for wedding parties. It may be possible to get it for Friday October 24th. The party fund raising committee will discuss the further when Griselda returns.

Bill Wishard said besides the 4 tickets to the sold out Rotary Foundation Paul Harris Dinner November 8 at the Biltmore Hotel that have already been reserved for the Malibu Rotary Club he was able to order 2 more so have 6 and they all seem to have peoples names on them—Hubert sent check to District office. The next Rotary District Breakfast is October 7 with speaker Jeff Whitfield. Members are encouraged members to make reservations to go the Literacy Breakfast at Lawry's on August 13 which will have two speakers, the Founder and Chair of Vision to Learn Austin Beutner and Los Angelilst County District Attorney Jackie Lacey.

Malibu Rotary will again be selling water and watermelon at the Malibu Kiwanis Chili Cook off on Labor Day weekend. There was a discussion on how we can make it more profitable. One suggestion is do what was done when Kevin Boling was president and have each club member bring one 24 pack of water. To make it uniform that year each member specifically bought and brought a 24 pack of Arrowhead water. Certain members who have been unable to attend our recent meetings have helped make past participation at the Chili Cook Off a success. Specifically Jack Corrodi has supplied table, chairs, and buckets for ice and Chris Bauman has used his pick up truck to make multiple runs to Pepperdine to keep the buckets filled with ice. Chris' wife Leslie is expecting their second child in August and Jack has been unable to attend any events recently because of health problems.

Someone who is normally at each Malibu Rotary Club meeting but missing for this one was **Fred Cornett.** His son was taking him to lunch to celebrate Fred's 90th birthday.
